

Neighbourhood Plan Questionnaire

The West Bergholt Neighbourhood Plan Questionnaire which appeared in June's Bulletin has been enthusiastically supported by residents in the village and wider parish area. Around 450 replies were received with a third being filled in on line via the link in the West Bergholt Website.

A big THANK YOU to all who filled it in; this represents about a third of all households who receive the Bulletin and means that the survey will be a representative sample of the community's views. A big THANK YOU also to Ash's, the doctor's surgery and the Co-op for their willingness to have the collection boxes. The draws for the hamper and the voucher for the youngsters will be made shortly.

All the written comments have been read and we will endeavour to incorporate them in our final analysis. That will now take place over the next few weeks with the Steering Group members busily collating and reading all responses. Without wanting to give too much away: traffic issues topped the list of concerns as it did with the previous Parish Plan survey.

The area of the Neighbourhood Plan has now also been ratified by the Borough Council. Following the end of the consultation on this matter and a recent Planning Committee, our plan area is now confirmed as corresponding to the existing Parish boundary.

We will keep you informed of the outcome of the questionnaire analysis via future Bulletins but the survey results are likely to be published initially on *www.westbergholt.net*. We will also endeavour to contact those that showed an interest in joining the Steering Group – but why not check the notice boards and come along to the next advertised meeting.

Do you have, or do you know someone with Sight Problems?

Being able to see is something we all take for granted until something goes wrong with our eyes. Have you ever thought how difficult it would be to live permanently in the gloom of a power cut, coping with the everyday tasks of housework, reading post and unable to see what the time is.

If you have recently been diagnosed as **Sight Impaired** by your optician or hospital and do not know what to do next, help is available. **Essex Sight** (part of the Essex Blind Charity) is a local charity offering support, information, care and equipment for people with visual impairments across Essex.

Many eye conditions are controllable especially if caught in the early stages and only a small percentage of people lose their sight completely. Even if you are told there is nothing that can be done to improve the medical condition of your eyes, enhanced lighting, magnifying glasses, talking watches, clocks and kitchen aids are some of the equipment that we can help you with. We also provide information on useful services such as financial assistance available, talking newspapers and books and local clubs and can make home visits.

Everyone is welcome to come along to our Sight Centres, whether registered visually impaired or not. You can drop in and browse and have a coffee and a chat to our staff and volunteers, some of whom are visually impaired themselves so understand what it feels like.

Essex Sight is the community services division of Essex Blind Charity providing information and equipment for people with sight loss.

West Bergholt History Group

The group activities have continued throughout the summer with a series of visits to place of historical interest.

May - Brightlingsea

In May the group visited All Saints Church at Brightlingsea whose 100ft tower can be seen for miles. Local guide, John Riley, gave us a comprehensive tour showing us brasses dating from the 15th century and memorials to the Beriffe family who were shipping merchants during the towns heyday as a major port. There is also a unique frieze of ceramic tiles running almost the entire inner wall of the church naming every Brightlingsea resident lost at sea since 1860.

June - Manningtree

The June meeting was a guided tour around Manningtree, reputed to be England's smallest town, 22 acres of which five are mud! The origins of the town are 13th century and it also gets a mention in Shakespeare's Henry IV. Manningtree is also well known for its most infamous resident Matthew Hopkins, the Witchfinder General. The opening of the river to commercial traffic in 1713 and the coming of the railway in 1846 really opened up the town for business and it became very prosperous during the Victorian period particularly thanks to the brewing and malting industry.

July - Coggeshall

For our July visit we were in Coggeshall for another guided tour by a local historian. The town is very old, originally a settlement on the Roman road out of Colchester. The most famous building in the town is probably Paycockes, built in the mid 16th century and now owned by the National Trust. Coggeshall appears so quiet and rural now but, years ago it was a hive of industry, milling, maltings, brewing, tanning, cloth making, blacksmiths, wheel and millwrights. Up until the dissolution of the monasteries Coggeshall had a huge Abbey and the town achieved a degree of notoriety in modern times around the case of Doctor Jones and his missing wife.

The visit to Aldford Mill in August will be reported in the next issue.

From September to November our meetings revert to talks in the Orpen Hall on the second Wednesday of every month starting at 8pm.



Village Traffic Safety Plan

In response to issues raised by village residents in the Parish Plan of 2009 the Parish Council spent nearly two years consulting various parties before producing last year a Traffic Safety Plan for the village. The plan which is available on the village website was endorsed by the Local Highways Panel and formed the basis for the funding for the projects under current consideration.

Early indications from the comments on the returned questionnaires from the whole village for the present Neighbourhood Plan are that the most pressing concerns of residents continue to centre on traffic issues, and in particular speeding and parking. The particular dangers are perceived to be in the areas leading up to the school and the Co-op, both of which provide vital services to the village. Clearly many would support actions to address these dangers.

The Parish Council is now actively pursuing the implementation of this Traffic Safety Plan and is engaged with Essex County Council (ECC) engineers in drawing up plans for safety works in New Church Road. These will inevitably involve some restrictions on the speed of traffic and parking. The Council is committed to ensuring that the measures have a positive impact by meeting the aims of the plan whilst at the same time considering the views of village residents. The intention is to create an environment where parents of older pupils at the school feel safe in allowing their children to walk, or even to cycle, to school unaccompanied thus removing the need to use their car. This clearly does not exist at the moment and to do nothing will not improve safety.

Set out below are the proposed measures for adoption recommended by the Parish Council. Any suggestions for changes will be considered before a final version is submitted to ECC Highways for the portfolio holder's approval. Once obtained formal notices of the works to be carried out will be published by ECC.

- **1** No parking double yellow lines for 15m (the statutory length) at each junction with New Church Road. *This will enable enforcement to be carried out by the relevant authorities*.
- **2** A low level rectangular table at each end of New Church Road. *The aim is to check driver speeds and raise awareness of potential pedestrian presence ahead. It is likely that low level lighting will be needed at these points no specific plans are currently available.*
- **3** Time restricted parking (single yellow line) for about 20m spanning the footpath from Mumford Close into New Church Road together with minor works to improve the crossing point. *This is considered essential at school journey times to give children a clear view down the road.*
- **4** Time restricted parking from the zig zags for 20m towards Lexden Road. *Designed to give a clear view around the dangerous bend in the road.*
- **5** Improved signage at the junctions of New Church Road with Chapel Road and Lexden Road and of School Lane with Colchester Road.

A composite plan of these works is on display on the village noticeboard and a more detailed plan of a particular area is available from the Parish Clerk.

In addition to these measures the Parish Council is considering making an application for a 20mph speed limit in New Church Road and School Lane. This application is more likely to succeed if the above measures are implemented first. 

The work of the Friends continues throughout the year. Our May guided nature walk saw a 'full house' of 23 walkers, which was very heartening. Although this walk is traditionally about the Bluebells, the late season this year meant that they were still not at their best. However the same conditions have resulted in the flowering periods of many flowers being squeezed together, increasing the variety of what could be seen. As they entered the wood they were welcomed by a beautiful spread of Wood anemones and this year's spectacular display of Early Purple orchids.

Several members of the group were able to see one of our resident Nuthatches as it fed on one of the large Ash trees. This species is scarce in this part of Essex, so we are lucky to have some in Hillhouse Wood.

This year's Dawn Chorus saw 32 people turning up at 3.45 am. As we reached the main entrance a solitary Robin struck up its fluid song, and we could hear a Nightingale singing lower down the wood together with a Blackbird. The Blackbird is sometimes referred to as 'the poor man's Nightingale', so we had a good opportunity to compare the two. We then travelled down the hill to where we had arguably the highlight of the walk: the Nightingale that we had first heard had continued to sing throughout the walk so far. By now we were only a few yards from its bush, but it continued to sing unabated. Everyone in the party was able to thoroughly familiarise themselves with a Nightingale in full cry. In all, there was a total of 21 species making this a very respectable event.

Working Parties continue as part of the management of the Wood. June saw a very productive session focusing on maintaining high standards of safety for those walking through the Wood. We completely dismantled the old fence that was around the 'canyon' near the bottom stream and also levelled out the sleeper type bridge below the bottom pond. In addition we worked on the rhododendron bridge, replacing a sleeper and levelling out the timbers.

None of the above could happen without the voluntary help of all those involved backed by the support of our members.

Edible Essex featured in this July's BBC Country File having generated 1,342 entries from Essex primary school pupils to design a vegetable plot, grow the produce and create a menu to which produce from their vegetable plot could contribute. The eventual winner came from Birch Primary School. Let's hope next year the winner comes from West Bergolt. Hopefully the Heathland's class visit in July to the allotment plot will

contribute to this when three staff and their pupils gained first hand knowledge from current plot holders.

Giving children a good start is very much at the forefront for the Blue Bells Pre-School located at Orpen Hall. With the assistance of experienced plot holders the Blue Bells pupils have developed their own allotment plot to produce vegetables which they plan to eat in the coming months as part of their 'hands on' tuition to understand how the food they eat is cultivated.

Finally many of the longer standing plot holders will remember Stan Rideout (Stan the mole!) plodding down New Church Road in his wellies with spade. Sadly Stan passed away at the age of 89 recently, having been in a nursing home for several years. Prior to that he lived with his sisters, Betty and Kathleen, who also died within a few days of each other earlier this summer having lived in the village all their lives. The village has lost real characters.

There are no strangers at the allotment site, but just new acquaintances to be made when you join the allotment family – good growing to one and all.
