An Emergency Plan for West Bergholt

This is a plan which has been developed by the Parish Council with the help of Colchester Borough Council and the Emergency Services to help us in the village cope with an unforeseen situation which needs rapid and decisive action. Emergencies can occur with little or no warning and could be caused by many different factors including:

Natural disaster
Severe weather
Technological/industrial accidents
Power failures

Failure of communications (e.g. telephones or broadband)

Transport disruption and village cut off Terrorism

The risk to the village from any of these events is small and difficult to assess. In the event of a situation deemed to be an emergency the Borough Council is the responsible body that will work with the Emergency Services. Our role is strictly to support these actions. The village plan focuses on how the Parish Council would assist in providing an emergency Reception Centre and how it could support vulnerable village residents. The document which can be seen in full on the village website is deliberately short and hopefully of practical use.

To carry out our role the Parish Council needs access to a team of volunteers who could carry out activities such as staffing a Reception Centre at the Orpen Hall. Various village groups do already have such volunteers and these will be contacted but should you be willing to assist in such activity please contact Harry Stone through the Parish Clerk <code>westbergholtpe@googlemail.com</code>

The Parish Council believes that in some emergency situations (e.g. prolonged power failure in severe weather) some vulnerable residents could be at risk. A list of such residents is to be compiled although it is appreciated that holding such information has to be handled sensitively and with the accepted protection. Again existing organisations such as the Care Network and Churches will be contacted but also if a possible resident who it is known has no regular contact from relatives or friends please inform the Parish Clerk. No name will be added without personal contact being made and their agreement.

It is good to report that the Care Network is thriving and with steady recruitment of volunteers we feel confident that we can respond to most requests for help with transport.

The Care Network is there to help any residents of the village, whatever their age or need, to get to appointments if transport is needed and other means are not possible or available. Most of our journeys are to the Doctors' Surgeries or the Hospitals but other local appointments can be considered.

At the Annual General Meeting held on 30th April we reported almost 200 jobs carried out in the last year by about twenty volunteer drivers. There are a number of regular users but we feel it is likely that some residents could benefit from the service but are not aware of what we offer or how to contact us. We make no charge but small donations to help cover expenses from users are invited. 

A big thank you to all our helpers without whom the club would not be possible and special thanks to Amber Harlow.











West Bergholt Gardeners' Association



Our March meeting was devoted to lawns when Geoff Hodge came along to discuss the problem of maintaining our patches of grass which have all suffered from the appalling wet winter weather. He stressed that people should decide upon what type of lawn that they wanted to maintain as different needs did not require the same treatment. The types to bear in mind were the bowling green, the utility lawn and the second class lawn full of weeds, moss and bare patches. The latter was likely to have been a weekend lawn being cut as low as possible to avoid having to get the mower out again in the 'foreseeable' future – a definite candidate for a new start from scratch policy.

You should regard grass as you would any other plant in the garden, needing good soil, aeration, feeding, regular watering and scarifying after moss killer had done its job. Note that scarifying before the moss is dead will only spread the moss and cause further problems. The height of cut is important and 1.5in or 2in is recommended and you might well keep on mowing throughout the year weather/ground permitting. In shady positions a cut height of 2in.- 3in is recommended. Using these guidelines a greener thicker grass should develop during the year, but do not forget the autumn/winter feed. Established lawns are best cared for by raking out dead and creeping grass and finishing with a broom. If required overseeding can be done preferably in spring.

The presentation was well received by the members and Geoff, after demonstrating several items, gave them to the club for the usual raffle.

The speaker in April, was Richard Ford who made a return to the Club to talk about one of his favourite plants — Hostas

The Annual Plant Sake was held in May at the Orpen Memorial Hall. Most interests were catered for with bedding plants, shrubs, trees and vegetable plants. Also gardening Bric a Brac stall.

Our major outing of the year is a coach trip to Waddesdon Manor, Aylesbury on 19th June leaving Orpen Hall at 8.30am returning from Waddesdon Manor at approximately 4.30/5.00pm. This will give time to see The

House and Gardens including the Aviary, Water Gardens and the Wine Cellars.

Over 300,000 visitors go to Waddesdon every year to see the House and Gardens as well as visiting the shops, restaurant, café, wine cellars and the plant centre.

NEWS RELEASE from NE Essex CCG

In March a warning was issued to patients about a hoax email.

At least two GP practices in NE Essex have had patients phone in worried about a hoax email. The email looks as if it has come from NICE, the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence, and people are advised not to open it, and not to click on any links.

NICE says the contents are likely to be distressing and has reported the hoax to the police.

It is not clear exactly how many people are affected, but based on the high number of calls to the organisation it is thought to number thousands nationally.

Sir Andrew Dillon, the chief executive of NICE, said: "A spam email purporting to come from NICE is being sent to members of the public regarding cancer test results.

"This email is likely to cause distress to recipients since it advises that 'test results' indicate they may have cancer.

"This malicious email is not from NICE and we are currently investigating its origin. We take this matter very seriously and have reported it to the police."

NICE is advising people who have received the email - the subject line of which is important blood analysis result - to delete it without opening and not to click on any links.


at Nayland Choir's Summer Concert
