A Safer Village

It is now almost a year since the Parish Council adopted a Traffic Safety Plan for West Bergholt. The Plan recognised that no one measure on its own could solve the problems caused by traffic and parking in a village whilst trying to retain the features that make it special. The physical adjustments proposed were accepted by Essex County Council through the Local Highways Panel and when in place there is a clear need to work with the school and parents to use the areas of concern responsibly.

Progress so far has seen the footpath along the edge of Poors Land well used by those parents using the Treble Tile car park to drop off children for school. Work is now taking place on the Orpen Hall Car Park and together with the improvement to the crossing at the end of New Church Road it is hoped that this will become a more attractive dropping off venue. The work at the end of the footpath from Mumford Close has improved the visibility for those entering New Church Road. New SLOW markings and SCHOOL signs are in place.

After a survey by Essex County Council a 20mph speed limit for New Church Road, Church Close, School Lane and Heathside has been agreed and this should be in operation by the end of November. Speeding in the area is not always a problem but the limit will raise awareness for drivers to exercise special care around the school. The red patches across the road, seemingly established prematurely, will be used to define the area for the limit.

Irresponsible parking at junctions is still perceived by many residents to be the greatest danger, especially to our children on the way to school, as visibility at key points is impaired. The restrictions agreed by the Local Highways Panel, as shown on the plans on the noticeboard, will now be implemented with the appropriate lines being in place by the end of September.

As a village we need to make this plan work and hopefully by working together we can make a difference.



The September course, Coastal Ecology and Conservation by Fred Boot, was very informative and of great local interest to all who attended.

The spring course, The Sultanate of Oman, was given by Graham Platts who had spent some time as a teacher in Oman and has first hand knowledge of the region, its history, government, politics and culture. He brought in objects including clothing and jewellery and members of the class tried the recipes he gave out each week. Our knowledge of Oman, a part of the world most of us knew little about, was considerably increased.

In March, Elizabeth Hurley formally stood down as secretary to The West Bergholt Branch of the WEA.

She was presented with a booklet of all the courses she had arranged since 1992, a rose bush and a chocolate cake shared with members of the class. Elizabeth has attended some 64 courses on diverse topics such as: The Golden Age of Dutch Art, Modern Iraq, the History of the East End of London, Wildlife and Conservation in Essex and Weather and Climate. As well as arranging the courses, she designed posters, distributed them for publicity, ordered books from the library, hosted the committee meetings and provided the refreshments for each evening. All this was done in a friendly and efficient manner and her input will be greatly missed by all, especially the committee. We hope to see her at many more evenings when she can relax and leave the worry to others!

The next course, a series of ten talks, starts on Tuesday 23rd September 2014 at 8.00 pm. in the Methodist Hall which has wheel chair access. Roger Beckett will be speaking on 'The Great War: Fact Myth and Memory. The course attempts to consider the Great War as an historical event, to separate fact from myth and to place events of 1914-1918 in the context of Europe in the 20th century. The fee for ten interesting evenings is £48 with nil fees for those on Income Related Benefits or JSA. Financial help should be obtainable from the Discretionary Learner Support Fund via WEA Cambridge if the net household income is under £15,050 per annum.

Garage and Shed Security

Whilst most houses have adequate security, what is often neglected is the shed or garage. "Nothing much in there" I hear you say, "just a garden spade and fork", but these are perfect tools for burglars to use. Adds insult to injury when the tool used to break into your house is your own, so give it some attention.

Garages and sheds, by the nature of their construction and position, especially when away from the house, are always going to be vulnerable. Always consider supplementing the existing locks, fitting alarms and adding security lighting. Don't forget the hinges - ensure they cannot be unscrewed.

Protect windows with a wire mesh and fit a curtain or white wash the windows to prevent prying eyes.

Visibly security mark your property with your post code and house number. This reduces the value to the thief; you can even register serial numbers free of charge at www.immobilise.com.

Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) groups are a proven deterrent to crime. The criminal will not wish to be

observed and NHW helps local communities work together to help reduce crime.

The season is not far off now and we look forward to our usual kick-off barbecue on 14th September at 3pm on the Orpen Field.



A Shameful Side To Our Village

Six years ago The Parish Council assumed responsibility for the tennis court area of the Orpen Field. A key aim is to promote the use of this facility and to make it more readily available to village residents for tennis and other sports. To this end membership of the West Bergholt Sports Club has attracted about twenty families and casual use can be booked at the Co-op at a fair price. The

Council has not sought to make any profit from the facility but simply to set aside enough each year to maintain it in good condition and replace the surface when it becomes necessary.

For security and safety reasons the management committee introduced a coded locking system on the main gate. This has generally worked well but sadly some individuals have abused it and gained entry, misusing the area, repeatedly damaging nets and equipment which have needed replacement at a cost of over £500. The attraction to young people for football was recognised and so a goal area was provided lower down the field and this was well used and appreciated.

It is sad to report that despite efforts to maintain security, unauthorised entry has continued culminating in an act of vandalism on the lock which has completely ruined it and will cost over \$200 to replace. To make matters worse a temporary padlock with a chain securing the gate was stolen on Saturday 9th August and was captured on CCTV. Those involved are in the process of being identified.

In the meantime the court area remains open. A notice asks that no football is played and the nets are not interfered with. Also children under ten are not allowed on the courts unsupervised. Parents are asked to ensure that their children respect this.

The management committee will meet shortly and make recommendations to the Council about the future of the facility. Any information on the incidents described above or suggestions for future means of access and the booking of the courts will be welcomed by the Council.







History of the Higgs Family.

The June edition included some photographs from the History Group collection. One shows a man and boy outside a shop D. Higgs. The only caption on the back is "Keith and his Father outside shop in 1957". This must have prompted the following very welcome addition.

In 1953, the Higgs family took over the local West Bergholt village shop. I seem to remember the shop was owned by the Pitts family originally. That part of Bergholt was known as Pitts Corner. I lived next door at Ashbourne cottage. I was eleven years old.



The Higgs family consisted of mum and dad, Graham, Keith and Peter. The shop was not as it is today, obviously. I seem to remember there was a big barn at the rear, and as I was an ardent little tap dancer, I performed for them, sometimes charging tuppence. They were a lovely family, especially Mrs. Higgs, who was very kind to me. My mother and I were very poor, and she would often feed me.

Bergholt of course was really a pretty village in those days. Opposite our homes were Popular trees and a field. In fact Bergholt was almost entirely full of fields like most villages in those days. It was very friendly and everyone knew everybody else. We played all over, up Armoury Lane which only had a few houses. The Brewery was there, and the old night watchman would often give loads of us tours around the brewery. We would sometimes sneak bad beers which had been rejected, get a little tipsy and go on to the brewery field to try to ride the cows. No PC in them that days.

Of course, there was no electric till about 1955 (I think) no sewerage, and no gas. When I finally left in 1957 all these services were then connected. At about this time, the Higgs family emigrated to New Zealand.

I often thought about them, then about ten years ago, Keith and his wife Marcie came to the UK to see family, and he wanted to show his wife where the shop was. Apparently, this was put in the Parish Magazine, and he expressed the wish to see his old friend Wendy Norfolk again. My best friend, who resides in Bergholt forwarded the magazine to me, and I got in touch with him. We corresponded quite infrequently, and then I heard from him with the sad news his wife had passed away. He was also newly retired. He decided to return to the old Country, travelling over on a cargo ship. We arranged to meet up, and after 60 years met outside the old shop, and it was lovely to see each other, if only for a couple of hours. Keith had been looking over the village before I arrived, and was so surprised to see how much it had changed. I do not think there will be anymore visits as N.Z. is a long way away, and we are all getting older. We will definitely be keeping in touch!
