A bit of Christmas advice

As Christmas approaches we are all busy rushing around to get everything done, presents to be purchased, office functions to attend and the house decorated. The thief loves Christmas too because it gives them the opportunity to have Christmas on you – Go on spoil their Christmas, do not give them the opportunity to spoil yours.

So here are a few tips for you and to pass on:

Parking – Choose a safe place to park (look for a www.parkmark.co.uk accredited car park), physically check your car is locked before you leave it and don't leave anything attractive to the thief on display within the car.

Purse/wallet/handbag – A handbag on the back of a chair, in a trolley, a purse sitting in an open bag, a wallet in the back pocket, a mobile phone on the table in a restaurant are calling out to the thief steal me. Don't make it easy for the thieves by providing them with the opportunity to steal it. If it's a crowded place or where you are distracted you are more at risk.

Out for a drink? – Enjoy a drink but don't make yourself vulnerable by drinking too much. Tell someone where you are going and when you expect to return, Don't be distracted by your environment whilst using a mobile phone or personal music device. Use a reputable taxi company don't jump into any car, and if you think your nominated driver has drunk too much discourage them from driving and in any case don't get in the car with him or her.

Home – When you are out make your house appear occupied (i.e. lights on timers, radio on), make sure your house, gates and shed/garage are secure. If storing drink or other items in an outbuilding don't have them in public view and don't leave presents under the Christmas tree in view from outside. After Christmas don't advertise your new goods by displaying the boxes for collection in front of your house. Turn the boxes inside out or tear them up or bag them.

Social Media – When using "Facebook" or other be wary of announcing to the world that you are away and your house is empty, or showing what you got for Christmas. Make sure your profile does not contain private information that would identify you or your address to a stranger.



Allotments for All

Many residents consider that one of the attractions of our village is to have a thriving Allotment site at its centre. With about 140 plots there is a small turnover of plot holders each year and generally those whose names are on the waiting list do not have to wait too long.

As one year's growing season comes to an end and we begin to plan for the next a few plots do become available so now is the time to get your name down for the coming year. Many reasons are cited for having a plot from escaping from the kitchen, to meeting friends for a gossip, but not least growing fresh vegetables (organically if required) at a cost

which saves money. A word of warning is that making a success of a plot does require some effort and a regular commitment and does depend to some extent on the weather and beating the birds and the bugs. Most plot holders win these challenges and we have just experienced a very productive year.

For those new to gardening we recommend to begin with a starter plot of 2.5 rods (63 sq metres)*. For the more experienced and ambitious a full plot of five rods (126 sq metres)* might be more appropriate. As a result of the way plot holders volunteer to carry out much of the maintenance work on the site themselves, the Parish Council is able to offer a plot for a rent of £16 per year, a charge that will remain unchanged next year, and with concessions for those over 60.

Whatever the experience there are always many seasoned plot holders on the site willing to offer advice and support and this can also be found along with guidelines and rules on our web page of the village website (www.westbergholt.net/village-life/clubs/allotments/). The site is managed on behalf of the Parish Council by a committee of plot holders whose Chairman is Terry Claydon. The Carol Service at the Old Church will be on Sunday 21st December at 2.30pm.


Christmas Eve services are the Crib Service at 3.00pm and the Carol Service at 6.45pm.





West Bergholt History Group

In September we started back at the Orpen Hall, after a summer of visits, with a talk by Roger Green on 'Green Men'. He told us where to look in churches and other old buildings for a green face. There are some in the Sudbury Church in the High Street.

In October we had a talk by Paul Rusiecki on WWI. He spoke about the relationship between the village and the troops that arrived here as war preparations started. We also heard about the 'explosion' of the population of Colchester.

The last talk in our 2014 season was given by David Austin about The Vikings and their culture and influence. Many peopl's understanding of the race has been based on Hollywood's interpretation which is a long way from the truth. For example Viking warrior's did not have helmets with horns on and despite their warlike reputation were surprisingly cultured and civilised.

From 865 Essex was subject to increasing raids by Vikings who eventually gained control of the eastern half of the country including Essex, which became subject to Danelaw. Colchester was under the control of the invaders from 879 until Edward the Elder recaptured it in 921.

We saw examples of Viking/Danish weapons, armour and jewellery and heard about how the long boats were built and the amazing extent of the Danish influence around the world. How they managed to cross the Atlantic in open boats without modern navigation aids was quite incredible.

Eventually all the Viking conquests were recaptured by the Saxons inhabitants but many Danish/Viking influences remain, for example, in place names such as Kirby Cross and Thorpe le Soken. An interesting talk and conclusion to our 2014 programme.

Or next talk will be at the Orpen Hall on Wednesday 14th January 2015. Our speaker is Ken Rickward who will be talking about the Stour navigation.

We meet every second Wednesday except December, in the Orpen Hall starting at 7.30pm.

Do come along to our meetings and give us a try!

Babysitting Circle Celebrates 40 Years!

Yes, there is another 40-something in the village, but nobody is entirely sure 40-what! When I joined the West Bergholt Babysitting Circle six years ago when I moved to the village, I was told, as new members are, that it had started in the 70's. But nobody knows exactly when as no records exist from those early days.

So I decided to do a bit of asking around, and I found that we still have an early member living in the village. Shelagh Newman (nee Osborn) joined the Circle in 1974 when it was still very, very new, making the Circle approximately 40 years old this year... Happy Birthday to Us! Shelagh says there were 20 to 25 families in the Circle in those days and she made new friends through the Circle.

And 40 years on the Babysitting Circle is still going strong; providing a mutual, cash-free, babysitting service for those families who are not able to ask their extended family or who do not want to use paid sitters. Speaking from personal experience, over those six years, the circle has been invaluable to our family. My parents and in-laws both live over two hours away, so we cannot ask them to babysit. But we have had the benefit of experienced mums (and occasionally dads - my boys love that!) babysitting for us for free. And all I have to do is sit for other families in return. The Circle works on a reciprocal points basis and no money changes A points tally is kept by the monthly bookholder, and when someone needs a sitter the bookholder asks around for someone to do the sit. starting with the family with the lowest points so that they have the opportunity to sit and earn points back. It's fantastically simple and fair.

We meet three times a year to introduce any new members and go through any matters arising (i.e. we have a good old chin-wag and a glass of wine!) Like Shelagh a generation before me, I too have found the group one way of meeting people and making friends.

Information for the residents of West Bergholt

I am a serving Police Officer attached to the Community Safety Partnership hub at Colchester Police. I run a successful operation (detailed below) and I am always looking to recruit new members. I am contacting you in the hope you may be able to print the information below in your next news letter

Operation Homeguard is a successful Essex Police project run in Colchester. The concept of the Operation sees members of the local community joining Police officers and staff in order to offer public reassurance in identified areas. Members of Operation Homeguard see themselves engaging with residents, informing them of crime issues in their area and giving crime prevention information. They are a high visibility deterrent.

The Operation gives volunteers the opportunity to work with Police and gain experience of working with the public. All members are issued with Police Volunteer Identification, Note Book and specially commissioned uniformed jackets. This is a non-confrontational role and Police are always on deployments.

Avoid visiting A&E unless absolutely necessary

People across north east Essex are being asked not to go to the Accident and Emergency department at Colchester General Hospital unless they have a serious or life threatening condition.

The number of people who have visited A&E recently has risen, putting pressure on the hospital.

Several patients who visited the department have presented with minor injuries that could have been treated more appropriately and faster at an alternative NHS service.

The North East Essex Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) is urging the public to choose their health services wisely and to think twice before they go there.

Dr Shane Gordon, chief clinical officer at the CCG, said: "A&E should only be used for critical or life-threatening situations requiring medical attention, such as loss of consciousness, heavy blood loss, suspected broken bones, persistent chest pain, difficulty breathing, overdoses, ingestion or poisoning.

"It is vital that emergency services are free to help people with the greatest need. Patients with minor injuries which do not require a visit to A&E (such as cuts, wounds, sprains, strains and minor burns) can also be treated at Walk in medical centres or minor injury units across north east Essex.

"This will significantly help to relieve pressure on the hospital's A&E teams and reduce waiting times for all patients."

Alternatives to A+E

Please consider these ways of getting treatment faster:

Treat yourself for simple illness and minor cuts, sprains and burns. Keep simple painkillers and cough remedies in a safe place at home and have a first aid kit handy.

Ask your local pharmacist for advice on minor illness. They can provide expert advice and simple treatments.

Call 111 24 hours a day. Their specialist nurses can provide clinical assessment and advice.

North Colchester Healthcare Centre (incorporating the walk-in centre), Colchester Primary Care Centre, Turner Road, Colchester, telephone 01206 314015: A GP-led service providing treatment for minor injuries and illnesses, no appointment necessary. Open from 7am until 10pm. The centre also accommodates an x-ray facility with instant results provided. If the x-ray is normal, clinicians at the centre can offer advice and strapping, if needed. If the x-ray shows a fracture, the person will then need to visit A&E for appropriate treatment. This x-ray facility is open seven days a week between 9am-4.30pm.

NHS Advice on Flu Jabs

Dr Hasan Chowhan at NE Essex CCG said: "Flu is not just a cold – it can be a really serious illness for some people and it doesn't just affect older people. If you're pregnant, have lowered immunity or a long term health condition such as severe asthma, a chest or heart complaint, or diabetes then you should get a free flu jab from your GP or community pharmacy (chemist).

Simply contact your GP or community pharmacist to arrange a convenient appointment and get your jab. It's quick, safe and free for those most at risk from the virus.

Dr Chowhan, a local GP in Colchester, is encouraging everyone who knows anyone who may be at risk from flu to tell them how important it is that they get protected. People who are carers and frontline health and social care staff are also encouraged to get a free jab to protect themselves and those around them.

The flu vaccine changes every year to fight the latest strains of flu, so even if you had a jab last winter you need another one this year to stay flu safe. The jab doesn't contain the 'live' virus so it cannot give you the flu.

Dr Hasan Chowhan added: "Flu can increase the risk of developing more serious illnesses such as bronchitis and pneumonia, and can make existing conditions much worse. Flu can knock you off your feet and make it hard to look after the kids or go to work. In the most serious cases, seasonal flu might land you in hospital - it can even be a killer."

"If you're in any of the 'at risk' groups, the flu jab is completely free and is a safe way of protecting you and your family in a matter of minutes."

Thank you for the very kind reception to my previous letter.

I have faint memories of the war years. My brothers used to collect shrapnel from the bombs left over from the attacks on London and dropped near us. They had a lot, some of them big pieces. We used to hide under our dining table when the siren went off. I am not sure what good it would have been in a direct hit, but luckily we never had to find out! We were issued with gas masks - mine was Mickey Mouse - and we had to carry them everywhere. They smelt dreadfully of rubber, but you could make very interesting noises if you blew into them! At the back of the school were air-raid shelters, dark caves that the children were herded into when the siren sounded. After the war, Fredina Fisher and I used to creep into them, scare ourselves witless in the dark, and rush out again. Freddy's parents were the school caretakers, and lived in the house attached to the school.

The Americans had a base near Bergholt and they'd put on passes for the village children, taking us to the base where we were fed all sorts of food on ration to us, but plentiful for the Americans. I remember at one party I lost my coat, a great disaster then, but I can't remember now if I ever found it! The American convoys would drive past and we would shout out "got any gum chum?" and they'd throw us packets of chewing gum.

The farms had prisoners of war working on them - German and Italian - and we got to know them. We'd wave and have a chat although we weren't supposed to. I believe several of the prisoners stayed on in England after the war.

When we got to our teens we used to have dances in the Orpen Hall, often with a real band! Young people came from the surrounding villages and that was how we got to know each other. There were a lot of inter-village romances! Often we'd go into Colchester to dances. There were no late buses so we'd book Mr. Isom's taxi and share the cost. Mr. Isom was a lovely man, and if you got stuck in Colchester having missed the last bus, he'd let you pay later if you hadn't got enough money. On Coronation day we had a bonfire in the school grounds, a big dance in the Orpen Hall and Coronation Ale - supplied free if I remember correctly. I wasn't old enough to have any but I must admit that I did anyway!

We had a table-tennis club in the scouts hall, and tennis courts along New Church Road. We'd spend most of the summer holidays playing tennis, and were expected to wear proper white clothes. Mrs. Churchman would tell us off if we didn't! The rector then was Rev. Douglas and he had a cream-coloured pug dog which he carried everywhere with him, even on his bike.

We had a lot of fun back then - making most of it ourselves! We didn't get into too much trouble, and if we did we'd collect a clip round the ear from the village bobby who lived up the Lexden Road in the police house. He'd get sued now!

Just a bit about me. Brocklehurst is a little village ten minutes from Dubbo - population thirty-nine thousand plus. We are in a mostly agricultural area, growing lucerne, wheat etc. Lots of sheep and cattle. Horses everywhere - we have three. I'm coach for Riding for the Disabled, which you also have in U.K. and I write a bit, short stories etc, some published in anthologies. Our weather is hot in Summer - today we had 31 C and getting warmer - but we have frost in winter. Our gardens have the same plants as yours but with a fair few hotter climate species thrown in. We have around an acre of garden.

I hope we can keep the West Bergholt/Brocklehurst link going every so often. Hoping West Bergholt has a super Christmas.
