Parish Council monthly meetings are held in the John Lampon Hall on the fourth Wednesday of every month starting at 7.30pm. Prior to the start of the meetings, between 7.15pm and 7.30pm, the public are invited to raise any item for consideration by the Parish Council at its next meeting.

The village bulletin is circulated on behalf of the Parish Council as part of a community service. It is issued quarterly and distributed to every household in the Parish. The views expressed do not necessarily reflect those of the Parish Council.

Parish Council Changes

The elections in May seem a long time ago now but it is worth noting that there were Parish Council elections for the first time in many years. Eleven Councillors were duly elected and following the inaugural Parish Council meeting, a number of changes are apparent. Firstly as many of you will know John Gili-Ross stood down as Chairman after many years leading the Council. John continues as a Councillor and chairs the Environment & Highways sub committee and will play a leading role in north Essex generally chairing the Colchester Association of Local Councils amongst other activities. John's service as Chairman was marked by a presentation at the Annual Parish Meeting in May which was attended by over 100 people from the community and he steps down having led the Council in fine fashion over the years guiding it to the quality status award achieved earlier in the year. I now have the honour of being the Chair of the Parish Council, and I hope that I can serve the community as well as John has done over the years. To support me in my role as Chairman, there are now two vice Chairs in Harry Stone and Andrew Savage. Full details of the Parish Councillors can be found on the inside front page of the Bulletin.

Following the election, our long serving Parish Clerk Val Walsom also stepped down and has been replaced by a new Clerk, Laura Walkingshaw. I would like to thank Val for her wonderful service to the Council over the years and to wish her well for the future. Characteristically Val has stayed on in a mentoring role with Laura to ensure that there is an orderly transition. We wish Laura every success in the new role. If you need to contact the Parish Council it is normally best to approach the Clerk in the first instance, again see the inside front page for Laura's contact details.

Changes like buses often come in threes, and the third change saw Rachel Howard resign as a Councillor to join her family in Malta. We wish her well in her new life and thank her for her support not just at the Parish Council but also for the many village activities she participated in, including the Neighbourhood Plan, the Brownies, BYG, the School and the Playgroup. We now have a vacancy, and there are posters advertising this and seeking expressions of interest from anyone who would like to be considered for the role. It is normal for

vacancies to be filled by co-option rather than for a formal election to be held.

Lastly our village handyman Steve Cook is leaving us to allow him more time to care for his mother. Steve has been keeping the village free of litter and undertaking a great variety of maintenance activities over the years and his efforts will be greatly missed. We are in the process of replacing him so that the task of caring for our village environment can continue.

There is no Parish Council meeting in August but we resume our meetings in September. Parish Council meetings are held on the fourth Wednesday of the month at 7.30. There is always a public session, so I hope many of you will be able to come along over the next few months to raise issues and ideas which you would like to see followed up - we would be delighted to see you.



Neighbourhood Plan – a great response from the community!

Many thanks to the literally hundreds of you who responded to the Issues and Options consultation on the Neighbourhood Plan (NP) held in the spring.

The consultation started in the Village Bulletin and on the website, but really took off when the exhibition was displayed at the Annual Parish Meeting and two further occasions in the weeks that followed. Over 100 people attended the annual meeting with a further 150 attending the other exhibition days.

Responses in the form of returned questionnaires were equally good, with around 200 responses received. These are now being analysed and a report of the consultation will be published on the village website later this autumn.

Over the summer the Steering Group has been in discussions with neighbouring Parish Councils and Colchester Borough Council. This is to ensure we learn from best practice and to keep in step with the master plan being assembled by the Borough Council, which is expected to consult on its New Local Plan early next year.

The next steps in the assembly of the NP are envisaged as follows

- -completion of the evidence base, including results of the recent consultations (autumn 2015)
- -spatial options, looking at where the best place for limited development could be proposed (autumn 2015)
- -consultation on spatial options (winter 2015)
- -drafting of NP (spring 2016)
- -consultation on Draft NP (summer 2016)
- -statutory aspects of the NP, examination in public, referendum etc (winter 2016)

As ever I close with an invitation to anyone who wants to join the NP Steering Group to get in contact with me. We are at the writing stage, so anyone who enjoys drafting concise and clear reports, analysing information or editing documents would be especially welcome! We meet on the first Wed. of the month at the John Lampon Hall.

Everyone in the class felt that they had greatly increased their knowledge of the "War to end all Wars"!

Our spring course was "Inland Waterways" by Stephen Worsley. Stephen spoke about the first canal builders and how canals greatly improved the transport of goods around the country especially in the Midlands. We then learnt of their gradual decline as the railways arrived and how the tourist industry is now helping to keep the surviving canals open and has even led to the revival of others.

After our summer break WEA's course for autumn 2015 is "Shakespeare's Villains" by tutor Ron Marks. This course aims to consider the origins of Shakespeare's Machiavellian and Satanic characters: explore the roles of political intrigue, ambition, warfare, sibling rivalry, jealousy, obsession and the impulse to revenge in unleashing violence and cruelty in the plays.

The course commences on Tuesday 15th September at 8pm and is held at The Methodist Hall, Chapel Lane, West Bergholt, CO6 3EF. It lasts for 10 weeks (with a break at half term for the AGM) and costs \$48. For those on income under \$15,276 net per annum or income based benefits/JSA it is free.


Leaders went to University and one had a change in work commitments so the Unit wish them lots of luck for September.

At the time of writing, the league program is yet to start, but the club is looking forward to continuing success, although last season will be a hard act to follow.
