Friends of St. Mary's Old Church

It was a beautiful sunny afternoon on Sunday 20th September and the Friends committee were delighted to welcome a large number visitors to the church. There was a delicious array of homemade cakes and a constant supply of cups of tea and coffee.

This was a special occasion to launch a history booklet about St. Mary's Old Church, called 'The People, Priests and Problems of A Country Parish', which the Friends had published this summer. Jon Lander, author of the booklet, spoke briefly about his book. He said he was interested in finding out about the people who worshipped at the church and about life in the village in the past. He added that bad news is frequently recorded but rarely good news so we should not think that life in West Bergholt was all bad. Peter Noakes showed a video with excerpts of our concert, which took place in the summer and also a slideshow of the many photos that he has taken of the church, some of which are included in Jon's book.

We had about one hundred visitors in the course of the afternoon and sold 55 books. It was a great opportunity for people to chat with Jon and Peter and meet with friends from the village. Mike Smith

Mike Smith, who was a well-known West Bergholt resident passed away on 10th October 2015. The overflowing church for the Thanksgiving service showed how many family, friends and work colleagues wanted to pay their respects to Mike.



Not many people these days are born and live their whole lives in the same place, but this was the case with Mike. He was born in Chapel Lane in a bungalow on the site of the house where his sister now lives.

He built the house where he and his wife of 54 years marriage lived – Micina in Chapel Lane – just a stone's throw from his childhood home. Mike went to West Bergholt School where he would have met Marlene for the first time. He also went to the same Sunday School, and later the Table Tennis Club, firstly in the old Scout Hut and later in the Methodist Chapel Hall, and much more recently in the Church Hall. Table Tennis was to play a big part in Mike's life and he always made time to teach this to others as well as different skills, of which he had many.

He was a Master Carpenter and Joiner – he always had a passion for working with wood, even as a small boy. At St Helena School he excelled in carpentry and joinery. At the age of 19 years he became an apprentice at the local building firm of MacNally's, with evening classes at Colchester Institute, to learn the theory too. At MacNally's, he rose through the ranks to become a senior partner in the business, responsible for surveying and estimating. There are many homes and local buildings that Mike was responsible for building, extending or renovating, and he will be remembered for his quality work.

He will also be remembered for many other reasons, apart from work – his racing pigeons and their magnificent lofts that were built as well as any house, as befitted a master craftsman. His allotment, where he would be seen digging and chatting, always with a cheery wave to passers-by. The corgis, which were loved by Marlene and Mike equally, earned them an invitation from that other famous corgi owner in 2013. They went to

Sandringham House to meet HM The Queen. In Mike's early days, he rode everywhere on his bike, but in later years, nice cars became his passion.

He was a genuinely good man, and it was always a pleasure to be in his company, with his ready smile and dry sense of humour. His real passion was his family though. Marlene and Mike brought up their son and daughter as well as their grandson with abounding love. Sympathy goes to all of them as well as to his sister at this sad time.

At the church service, he was remembered as a well-respected member of the village throughout his life, both in business and family life – A West Bergholt Boy through and through.

A message from Marlene and family – We would like to thank everyone for their kindness and tributes received in recent months, and for the overwhelming attendance at the church service.





West Bergholt History Group

Due to the lack of space in recent Bulletins, the History Group report needs to catch up, so here goes.

March 2015 began with our Annual Meeting. This was followed by Terence Nicholson, one of our members, giving an illustrated talk about Cressing Temple Barn.

In April Simon Gallop, a Blue Badge Tourist Guide came. His talk "Unknown Constable Country" was very interesting.

May was the first of our summer visits. Nick Ellis gave us a talk through the history of the Round Church at Little Maplestead.

In June we were given a very warm welcome as the first group to visit the Wivenhoe Chapel Museum, which had only opened the previous month. It is located in the middle of a cemetery in a small chapel, built in 1906. Although it is still consecrated, it is rarely used as the cemetery is virtually full. Their growing collection of items associated with the history of the town is expected to expand in the future.

Bernard Colbron presented the Mayor with a donation and wished the museum success for the future.



Our July visit was to West Mersea Museum to view their latest exhibition "Business as Usual – The Home Front in 1915". The very enthusiastic members of their group were justifiable proud of their much larger, established premises, complete with computers which they enjoyed showing to us.

In August for our last outing we paid a return visit to Alan and Pauline Matins in Great Tey. Another lovely evening exploring their ever-growing collection of fascinating items from the past, not to mention eating homemade cakes!

We returned to Orpen Hall in September. David Whittle of the Harwich Society came to talk about Captain Fryatt, a hero of WW1.

October provided a real treat. From the Colchester Archaeological Trust, Adam Wightman, site director of the excavations at Williams and Griffin gave an illustrated talk about the dig. This included telling us about his very exiting last minute discovery of buried treasure. The collection of gold and silver jewellery had been tightly packed into a very small pit, probably for safekeeping during the Boudiccan revolt. It had later been covered over by the remains of a collapsed building. Although this has been widely covered by the press, it was great to hear Adam explain the recovery process and how the conservators dealt with what we now call The Fenwick Treasure. Absolutely fascinating!

Fenwick Ltd. currently have the treasure on display in their Bond Street, London, store. Generously, they will be donating it, along with the display case, to Colchester Museum. It is hoped it will be on show in the Castle Museum by the spring.

In November Chris Farndell will come to talk about some of his experiences as a forensic photographer for Essex Police.

We do not arrange anything for the group in December to allow for all the Christmas arrangements and events.

Our first meeting in 2016 will be on Wednesday 13th January. At the moment we have had no information from our selected speakers, so look out for details. It looks to be an interesting year.

Our AGM will take place in March.

We meet on the second Wednesday of every month (not December) and during the summer months visit various historical places.

Help protect your young child from flu

Parents and carers across north east Essex are being reminded to get their young children vaccinated from the flu. Local GPs are asking parents to make an appointment to take their child to receive the nasal spray.

Last year many parents across Colchester and Tendring took advantage of the free vaccination to help prevent the spread of flu. It's hoped even more parents will take up the offer this year.

The nasal spray vaccination is available free on the NHS – as part of the national *Stay Well this Winter* campaign which has been recently launched. It's quick, effective and painless and available to children aged two to four years, as well as those in school years one and two, who can receive the vaccine in school.

Dr Nirmalan de Silva, a GP in Colchester, said: "The vaccination is given by squirting a single dose of nasal spray up each nostril. Not only is it needle-free, for children it works even better than the injected flu vaccine with fewer side effects."

Clinicians say that flu can be a particularly unpleasant illness for children.

Dr de Silva added: "Children suffer the same symptoms as adults including fever, chills and aching muscles. However some children may develop complications such as bronchitis, pneumonia and painful middle ear infection which may need hospital treatment. Vaccinating your child will not only protect them but also help to reduce the chance of flu spreading to others, especially amongst the vulnerable, such as babies, older people, pregnant women and people with serious long-term illnesses."

If you have children aged two, three or four, or in school years one and two, and have not yet vaccinated your child, you can phone your GP surgery to make an appointment to have the nasal spray vaccine.




Our eldest Brownies took part in the Rememberance Parade and Service at the Memotial Orpen Hall.
