

The Long Family

Frank Long was my grandfather, he was born in Fordham in September 1886. He married Alice Proom of Harwich in 1908 and they lived together at Primrose Cottage, Newbridge Hill, West Bergholt bringing up eight children. One of those children was my father, Frank Robert John Long, born in 1915. For a while he worked at Daniells Brewery. He moved to the south coast shortly before the last war, bringing up his family in Littlehampton.

Grandad Frank's father, old John Long and many of our relatives are buried at the Methodist Chapel in West Bergholt. Frank fought in the First World War and was gassed and received other wounds. He died young, at the age of 45 in 1931. Other members of our family, including his brothers also went to France.

Frank was the youngest of eight children, Arthur, Thomas, Percy, Daisy, Alfred, Leonard and Grace (married William Gower). After his premature death Alice moved with her children to Dedham, where many of our relatives still live. Frank had been employed in brickmaking amongst other jobs, he obviously had a hard life.

Primrose Cottage, near Whitehouse Lane, was a very small dwelling for ten people. Prior to getting married he had joined the local militia, it is not clear if he signed up early in the war or was called up later, but his experiences clearly shortened his life. One of his relatives, David Long, lived in Armoury Road, West Bergholt, and also served.

I have a great deal of information concerning the Longs, of West Bergholt. They moved into the Fordham/West Bergholt area in the 1820s from Hertfordshire. I am very happy to share my research with anyone who is interested and perhaps someone may be able to fill some gaps for me.

West Bergholt Local History

In February David Morgans gave us a fascinating talk, 'Milling Around Colchester'. He covered the history from the time that corn was milled by hand between two flat stones to the development of waterpower by the Romans through to the Doomsday survey when over 300 mills were recorded in Essex.

During the early medieval period mills tended to be owned by persons of means such as lords of the manor or monasteries. Villagers were not allowed to grind their own corn but had to bring it to the local mill where the owner charged them one grain in twenty-four which caused a lot of resentment amongst the locals.

By the 12th century windmills started to make an appearance meaning that a mill not dependant on a river could be set up almost anywhere. However the erratic nature of the wind meant that there would be no reduction in the number of watermills.

Towards the end of the 14th century the cloth trade in Essex began to dominate and many watermills converted to fulling, a process involved in the production of cloth. When the cloth trade declined towards the end of the 18th century most mills reverted to corn milling.

Wind and water milling continued unabated until the mid 1870's when a series of wet summers and vast imports of cheap grain from abroad made many traditional mills uneconomic.

New technology such as steam, electricity and railways meant that mills could now be built in more convenient places and gradually traditional milling became part of history. The last working windmill in Colchester, situated near to where Waitrose now stands, ceased working in 1906.

During the March meeting, members were invited to share their memories of the village. Despite initial reluctance, some snippets were recalled and Peter Noakes made a valiant attempt to record them, although this proved more difficult than expected. He had to rush about with the microphone as people began to speak and there was no structure. It became haphazard and almost impossible to transcribe, which was disappointing to say the least.

Following on from this, in April we were very fortunate that Andrew Phillips, Local Historian and founder member of Colchester Recalled Group, was able to come and guide us in the best way forward. Always an entertaining speaker, in his usual friendly way Andrew shared the benefit of his experiences. As well as giving advice about equipment, he explained the best way to set up to obtain good recordings and said that one-to-one sessions are easiest to manage (No surprise there then). He left us a copy of the interview guidance notes used by Colchester Recalled which will be a great help.

Andrew hopes we will progress with the project as there must be a wealth of information to glean, especially from older residents of the village. He said that these recordings are intended mostly for the benefit of future generations and typed transcripts should also be made, which we are welcome to store with the Colchester Recalled archive at the Museum.

This was an excellent final talk of the season which was enjoyed by everyone.

During the summer, the committee will endevour to purchase the necessary equipment. Meanwhile, please consider volunteering to be interviewed. Contact details will be published in the September Bulletin.

As a change from previous years, our summer visits will be in the daytime not the evening.

In May, we are due to visit Colliers Brick Works at Marks Tey.

Bergholt Heath Youth Football Club

As we near the end of the season we are close to our Awards Evening at Orpen Hall on Saturday 21 May. As a preview, I can advise the story so far...

This season has been a very mixed bag for the Under 7 team. Dan, our new manager, started back in July with a group of boys that all went to school together, so knew each other well, but didn't particularly know what they were getting into. I think they thought we were just going to have a kick about with each other every weekend.

Slowly, they have begun to understand the concept and with continued training from their school teacher, Mr Minter and the manager, they have emerged as a little team. The first few games showed their inexperience with a couple of big losses in a row. We believe this was a good grounding as it made the boys aware of how hard it could be. They then started to pick up a bit and score some goals, eventually getting their first draw of the season against Stanway Villa. It wasn't until November that they got their first win, but it gave the boys a big boost.

No cup runs of note but a very satisfying first season.

After a successful inaugural year for our Under 8 team, hopes were high as they moved to seven a side for the Under 9's. A couple of players left and were replaced by other boys. They train on a Saturday morning and play matches on a Sunday and at the time of writing this report our results have been as follows Played 23, Won 13, Drawn 6 and Lost 4 scoring 69 goals and conceding 23. Results that we are confident would put us in the Champions League spots in the Premier League and who knows, maybe even pushing for the title.

The boys have progressed significantly over the season and regularly give a very good account of themselves against the very best teams in and around Colchester. The manager and all of the parents are justifiably proud of all of the boys for how hard they have worked and the results and performances that they have achieved this season.

This season the Under 11's moved up to the 9-aside game and with it had the most successful season in their short four-year history. With the bigger pitch suiting their expansive brand of football, they have had more victories and scored more goals than any of the previous seasons. However, as is the roller-coaster that is this particular team, it hasn't been all plain sailing with not all results going our way.

That said it has been a very pleasing year and we are looking forward to continuing this progress in the U12s next season.

With the final upgrade to 11 a side football the Under 13s started the season full of hope and expectations.

They got off to a good start but the next few games saw the wind knocked out of them as other teams showed they had strengthened during the summer.

After a difficult autumn period the boys bounced back near the tail end of the season.

Performances got better and with that, results improved with a few wins to show.

They ended up 5th out of 8 in the C league. No doubt a few new players will be required (especially a keeper), anyone interested should give us a call.

Next season sees a change in management at Under 14s (as they will be) with Liam taking over the reins from Pete. Our thanks to him for all of this work. He isn't leaving the club though. David Bowden is stepping down as Secretary having taken over from me when I became Chairman and having done a great job over the last ten years in various roles. Our thanks go to him for all his hard work which will continue with the Youth Group Leslie Wright




