So what exactly is Neighbourhood Planning? Neighbourhood Plans are so new that you may not have heard of them yet. Neighbourhood Planning is a new right for communities to create agreed policies and proposals for their localities. For us this will be for West Bergholt and surrounding Parish area.

The plan will be used to decide the future of the development of West Bergholt including answering the following:

Where should new houses, shops or employment areas be built?

Should they be built?

Do we want further community assets and amenities?

Should we preserve existing open spaces and provide more?

Aside from development aspects what other improvements do you want to see in areas such as traffic, policing, environmental improvements etc?

The list could be endless – but is nevertheless of vital importance and the plan must be made and agreed by you.

Who is responsible for preparing the plan? The Plan is sponsored by the Parish Council, but the steering group overseeing the plan is drawn from the wider community and comprises over 20 people drawn from all walks of life. A full listing of Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) has been assembled on the village website so visit *www.westbergholt.net* and look for the Neighbourhood Plan tab.

As the season draws to a close, the Club has, for the first time, a Cup Final. No -

two Cup Finals to look forward to. Not only that, but our Under 14 team is in both of them. The League Cup and Open Cup, held at Wivenhoe on successive weekends in May. The results will be known by the time you read this. Whatever the outcome the boys have fully deserved their spring tour! A final league position in the top four is expected and the run-in to the end of the season has been remarkable after a sticky start. Watch out next year.

The Under 18 team have enjoyed their last season in the Colchester and District Youth League. The team and its players are very proud to have played all the way through to the final year or the final age group. The team draws boys from around Colchester but two Bergholt lads - Tom Hodder and Alex Bartlett have played all the way through from under 8s.

It looks like we will finish sixth or seventh from a league that originally numbered eleven teams. Our league campaign slightly petered out due to team withdrawals, but we had a boisterous cup run.

Our final match was the league cup quarter final versus Boxford Rovers which after recent poor weather was played in lovely spring-like conditions. Unfortunately injuries and work commitments meant we only had ten players and Boxford were bolstered by a number of strong players who normally play in men's league. There are eligibility rules which mean these fellows won't be able to play in the semi final, but unfortunately they don't apply to the quarter final. The match ebbed and flowed but we eventually lost 7-3 but had a great run out in the mid-April sun. Unfortunately, it is not only the last season for the boys but also for Iain Turner who has managed the team over the last five seasons.

After a mixed bag of results the Under 10's go into the last couple of weeks guaranteed a respectable mid-table finish of sixth place. After dipping into the local transfer market they have one new starter ready for next season and are in final negotiations with another fine player to complete their squad for next season. Hopefully not one that bites the arm (or hand) that feeds him! They are concerned that they will be playing on a pitch that will withstand their robust style. Wherever it is located!!

The Under 8's have nearly completed their first season in the C&DYFL. They have found it quite tough this year as they are playing catch up to a number teams who have already played together for a few years. However, they have still enjoyed playing and have put in some decent performances without necessarily getting the rewards they deserve. Hopefully next season will see an upward change in fortunes.

We look forward to next season where we hope to have at least one more new team - at Under 13. Finally we have our annual Awards Night for all players and their families, which will be held, as usual, at the Open Hall, on 8th June.

West Bergholt History Group



For our February meeting group member Peter Jones told us about the fate of Zeppelin L33, the German airship that was hit by anti aircraft fire after a bombing raid on East London. It crashed in a field in Little Wigborough during the early hours of September 24th 1916. The wreck site attracted 250,000 visitors including military top brass and leading politicians. Although the Germans set fire to the wreck it revealed many secrets that were incorporated in subsequent British airships.

At the March meeting we saw archive film footage about life in Essex in the 60s from a time when Colchester High Street was two-way and a pint of beer cost the equivalent of 10p in today's money!

Following the old Colchester theme our April speaker was Roy Walters, a Colchester Blue Badge guide who grew up in the Dutch quarter during the war. It was quite incredible to 21st century ears to hear that the houses did not have bathrooms and the streets were lit by gas. Roy also told the audience what it was like being a child of the 40s and 50s. Recalling that mother knew best he told of the many pieces of *good advice* children were given. "Don't put your elbows on the table", "Don't talk with your mouth full", "Children should be seen and not heard" and many more sayings that had the audience laughing and nodding at the same time.

We are visiting Brightlingsea Church on 8th May and on 8th August the group will be visiting Alderford watermill at Sible Hedingham.

Saving Lives!

The residents of West Bergholt will soon have 24 hour access to a defibrillator unit, thanks to the East of England Co-op.

Working in partnership with the East of England Ambulance Service, the Co-op is funding 100 defibrillators to be placed in communities across Norfolk, Suffolk and Essex, as part of the Every Minute Counts Campaign.

A defibrillator is a potentially life-saving machine that gives the heart an electric shock in some instances of Cardiac Arrest.

If you suspect somebody to be in Cardiac Arrest you should dial 999 so that an ambulance can be sent to you. If there is more than one person with the casualty, you will be directed to the defibrillator whilst the other person performs CPR.

The defibrillator will be in a yellow cabinet situated at the Co-op Store, West Bergholt. The operator will provide you with an access code to get into the cabinet. The defibrillator should be taken out and taken back to the casualty and the operator will provide guidance over the phone.

If someone is able to administer CPR or use a defibrillator in the first four minutes, whilst the ambulance is en route, there is a significantly higher survival rate. Once the ambulance has arrived the paramedics will take over.

The East of England Co-op and East of England Ambulance Service will be holding defibrillator demonstrations across the region, so you can see how it works and ask any questions you may have.

Joe Firmin

As you will have probably heard, our own famous wildlife expert, Joe Firmin, recently died aged 86.

Whilst well known throughout the village for his long term involvement with the Friends in leading bird and nature walks throughout the Wood both during the day and night, there was so much more.

Born near Fordham Heath, Joe spent much of his childhood in Bunting's 52 acre flower nursery where he developed a passion for nature. Following school he worked as a 16 year old cub reporter and then seven years in the Royal Welsh Fusiliers. Joe was asked to write a weekly nature column for the Essex County Standard. So, in 1952, he began '*Watching Wildlife*' which continued in the Standard until 2006 when it transferred to the webpages of the Colchester Natural History Society. It therefore ran for 60 years and was proudly known as 'Essex's longest running wildlife column'.

Not only did Joe help in 1953 to found the above Society (of which he was President at the time of his death) he was also a founder of the Essex Naturalists' Trust which is now the Essex Wildlife Trust. In addition, he was behind the creation of the Natural History Museum in Colchester High Street.

Whilst Joe will be remembered for many things, for me it will predominately be for his love and extensive knowledge of nature and the enthusiasm with which he passed it on.

Introducing . . .

In an occasional profile of those who live or work in West Bergholt, we talked to the village's new pharmacist Nik Shah.

When he took over the West Bergholt Pharmacy a year ago, Nik Shah did not simply want to run a successful business. He wanted to offer a range of clinical services within the village. In doing so he is putting the NHS policy of widening pharmacy services into practice.

Nik has already turned the former stock room of the Chapel Road pharmacy into a consulting room where he can offer confidential advice. He is also looking into providing new services such as testing blood pressure and 'stop smoking' support.

The business of course is based on dispensing prescriptions and here Nik is extending the service by picking up prescriptions from local surgeries and in some cases delivering medication to patients. "I am used to an ethos based on customer service," explains Nik.

As a young boy in Zimbabwe, he would help his parents in the family clothing shops, and he has always had a keen interest in his father's business as a pharmaceutical wholesaler.

But Nik's particular interest has been in a clinical role leading him to study pharmacy. On graduating from Aston University in Birmingham, he worked as a pharmacist with Boots the Chemist in London and then as a pharmacy manager in Rayleigh.

"But I wanted to run my own business and West Bergholt appealed to me because of the business potential and because of the community feel," said Nik.

His work is leading him to move from his home in Benfleet to Danbury – nearer the village but still convenient for the London area for himself and his optician wife Mital.

"I enjoy football and cricket and my wife and I like travelling but most of the past year has been spent working as being a community pharmacist takes up a lot of time," says Nik.
