After several months of construction, the brand new extension at the Queen's Head pub in West Bergholt will be open for business from Monday 4th September 2017.

Built entirely by local tradespeople, the extension is multifunctional and looks amazing. By using local tradespeople, it has supported local businesses and is a great advertisement for all those involved.

The aim of the new extension is to provide the pub with a new lease of life and can be used for a multitude of events, and can be hired out for private parties, celebrations, etc, and will be completely free of charge, opening it up to the community and beyond.



Dating back more than two hundred years, the Queen's Head will be having a dramatic make-over, taking place over the next few months. Many changes will be occurring, including new opening hours, a new chef and menu. There will be a total refurbishment of both bars, including a new lounge area with brand new furniture throughout. The toilets will be getting a complete overhaul and the gardens will be completely revamped, ready for next summer.

This lovely family pub is a great asset to the village, and come the summer of 2018, West Bergholt will have a community pub they can be very proud of!





Chairman's Musings

PC Changes

As a result of Phil Cook stepping down as a Parish Councillor, a replacement has been sought. As has been the norm of late, there was competition to be co-opted onto the Council, and after a ballot, David Short has been duly co-opted. David has been a Parish Councillor previously and has plenty of experience in this role.

Broadband – progress?

By the time you read this edition, Virgin Media will have finally stopped digging up the roads and pavements and service may even have been offered to households in the village. BT has installed their network as far as the Maltings, and County Broadband are still waiting in the wings for their opportunity to introduce better Broadband services. Maybe this time next year we will finally have a choice of services at a fast speed!

Traffic & Safety Strategy

Following a successful workshop, which provided the working group with plenty of ideas, a simple strategy document has been produced. This focuses on the *five* E's: engagement, encouragement, education, enforcement and engineering.

A Village Policeman?

Following the presentation given by the deputy Police and Crime Commissioner at the Annual Parish Meeting in April, the Parish Council has investigated the offer of a Special Constable dedicated to our area. This could become a reality as long as a local person can be sought. The Parish Council has resolved to support this initiative and will work with the Police to move this idea further.

Progress with the Neighbourhood Plan

Colchester's Local Plan is now at its final draft stage, and the Neighbourhood Plan is keeping step with this by adopting the levels of housing suggested for the village and producing a blueprint for this and other aspects of parish life. An exhibition is planned for the autumn.

Clerk's Jottings

Orpen Hall Flower Beds

Over the summer, work should have started to clear and replant the flower beds with new low maintenance shrubs. The initial planting scheme, introduced when the car park was resurfaced, proved susceptible to both flood and drought, and advice has been sought on a new, more versatile arrangement of plants which can both withstand the weather and be of relatively low maintenance.

Speed Limit Campaign

Our District Councillor Lewis Barber is campaigning for a 20mph limit in Chapel Road and a 40mph limit on the approaches to the village. This very much complements the work of the traffic and safety group.

Bus Stop to move?

Following concerns about over-crowding and poorly lit waiting environments, the Parish Council has submitted a request to reposition the bus stop in Colchester Road (Colchester bound) nearer to the Maltings. This would allow the provision of a passenger shelter as well as lighting.

Halls Repainted

Over the summer holidays, both the Orpen and John Lampon Halls have been repainted. The Orpen Hall has been made more attractive with a graduated colour scheme, so as to pick out some of the original art deco features. In researching this project, it was hoped to find details of the original late 1930's colour scheme, but no records survive. If any reader has any knowledge, then the Clerk would be pleased to hear of this!

Parish Council Meetings Resume

Following a break over the summer, the Parish Council meetings start again on Wednesday September 27th at 7.30 in the John Lampon Hall. We have had another good season in 2016/17, with many interesting speakers and events attracting both visitors and new members.

The Association's annual plant sale was held on 20th May at the Orpen Hall. But for the first

time, we held it on a Saturday rather than a week day. There were the normal amazing bargains to be had, with a wide variety of plants from herbs to trees, succulents to roses, perennials and annuals and everything in between. All the plants are donated by local gardeners, local businesses or the allotment holders, and they are all sold at bargain prices. The sale was a great success, and the new timing appeared to have made it easier for a wider range of villagers to attend than in recent years, so we will be keeping it on a Saturday going forward.

As always in summer, we offer a couple of club outings. In June, we went by coach to Helmingham Hall to see the gardens of this beautiful Tudor house and moat. 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


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Friends of St Mary's Old Church

Well, we have done it! Thanks to the marvellous generosity and support from villagers and businesses in the area, we have reached our target of $\pounds 10,000$ which was required to trigger the other grants and funding required to keep the bell ringing. It has only taken 8 months from the start of our fundraising efforts to meet the target, which goes to show the general

affection for our wonderful old church within the village. Thanks are due to all who helped in any way, and there are many of you. The fundraisers were led by Jane Lloyd, with a small team of Teresa Morris, Joan Gray, Nicole Long, Carrie Cresswell and Gill Poole. These ladies put in hours of work planning the many events which helped to raise the funds and the awareness of the appeal generally. Not only were the events well supported but they were fun, and there have been requests for more of the same. Thanks are particularly due to the Parish Council and to the Co-op, and to all of you who put the green tokens in the "right" box! The Friends were delighted to learn that a further £500 has been donated to the appeal from the Co-op green token scheme. Our thanks are due to all the shoppers who put the tokens in the box for the appeal, and to the Co-op for making this possible. It is hoped that a formal presentation of the amount will be made in the near future.

Planning is already in hand for more events, starting with a valuation day where you can bring along your treasures to see what they might be worth. A small fee is charged per item. Details are on page 21. Although we have reached our target, we would like to have some funds ready for the inevitable "extras" that seem to come along with all such major projects. One such sub project is the installation of a sympathetic light system, which would extend and enhance the potential use of the church for events in the darker days.

The Churches Conservation Trust, in whom the building is vested, are planning to start the external works on the roof and belfry shortly. They have had to wait until the bats which nest in the belfry have moved out to their summer roosting places.

Due to the uncertainties of the availability of the building, we have had no weddings there this year, but we hope that this will change when the works are complete.

We have had two excellent concerts recently, one being by Tom Cogan and friends and one by the Comrie Singers, along with Jubilant Brass. Thanks are due to those who entertained us so well.

We would like to recommend that families join the Friends group, thereby showing support for our endeavours. Membership is $\pounds 5$ a year, for which you get nothing but our thanks and the knowledge that you are helping to keep this priceless village asset in being.

Finally, we have said goodbye to our Treasurer Rhys Lloyd, who has stood down having been there from the formation of the group. Rhys continues to support as a member of the Committee. Margaret Jones has volunteered to be the new Treasurer, for which we are most grateful.

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
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West Bergholt Local History Group

On Wednesday June 8th, members of the group went on a visit to the Chelmsford and Essex museum in Oaklands Park, on the north side of Chelmsford. After a welcoming cup of coffee, we were conducted on a guided tour of the museum by the curator Nick Wittenden.

The museum holds an extensive range of exhibits, ranging from prehistoric fossils to current Essex wildlife. They also have a living bee colony where you can watch the bees at work. The story of Chelmsford is depicted from the Ice Age through to the development of the major industries such as Marconi's, Hoffman's and Crompton's.

The museum also houses the Essex Regiment Museum, which contains uniforms, weapons, kit and battle trophies from over 200 years of soldiering. Perhaps the most significant being the Salamanca Eagle, an ornament which topped a standard bearing the French colours. This was captured by the Essex Regiment from the French in battle in 1812, and subsequently adopted by them as their mascot.



It is considered a disgrace to lose your regiments colours in this manner and, even into the 21st century, the French have been trying to reclaim their eagle, but it still sits in the Essex Regiment Museum in Chelmsford!

Set in 12 acres of parkland, the museum also offers an adventure playground, not that any of our group were tempted! Admission is free and if you are looking for somewhere different to spend time in the summer holidays, this venue comes with a WBLHG recommendation.

On a hot sunny afternoon in July, fourteen members of the History Group were joined by five members from The Friends of Colchester

Museum, for a tour round New Hall School at Broomfield. This was once the Palace of Beaulieu, owned by Henry VIII, and for a while the home of Mary, his daughter, until she was evicted when the king granted the palace to George Boleyn, Anne Boleyn's brother. Only a small part of the original palace survives today, but Channel 4's Time Team did find the foundations of the original gatehouse, the west wing, and the chapel when an archaeological dig was carried out a few years ago. It has been a school since 1798, when the English nuns of the Order of the Holy Sepulchre purchased the site. The arms of Henry VIII are in the school chapel. Tony Tuckwell, who last year came to West Bergholt and gave a talk on New Hall, was our most informative and amusing guide. The tour concluded with tea, coffee and biscuits.

Ken Free is our speaker for the first of our autumn meetings in the Orpen Hall. The subject will be CAMP 186, the story of German POWs and the lost town of Berechurch. It is on Wednesday 13th September at 7.30 pm. All are very welcome. Please do come and join us. Members £2 and visitors £3.

LEARNING FOR LIFE

Our course for the autumn term is

"PERSPECTIVES OF PAKISTAN" by GRAHAM PLATTS

Pakistan is both an old and a new country. Its people are hospitable, yet sometimes wary of outsiders. We shall explore some fascinating contradictions of this little understood nation, including its place in a very diverse region and the historic cultural influences of its neighbours on north-west India. The arrival of the British brought new changes, and we can see this in microcosm through the history of a school between 1847 and the present day. We follow the process of India's Partition – the events that led to it and the circumstances in which it came about – before reviewing Pakistan's progress in the aftermath. The achievements of some artists (men and women) and those involved in sports are considered, followed by the story of Malala Yousufzia, who has gained international recognition through her campaigning for girls' education. Finally, we ask what it is like to live and work in Pakistan in the 21st century, arriving at some humorous as well as more challenging conclusions.

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Damage in the Wood

Over a year ago, I wrote about some proposed 'Restoration Work' that we would be undertaking in the Wood. It was as a result of a few visitors who decided that they would go 'off path' and form new tracks through both the bluebells and other areas.

I explained that there were two main problems resulting from these activities:

1) Once a route is created, it soon gets established by others following it, resulting in the sensitive ground structure being destroyed so that the vegetation cannot re-establish itself unaided,

2) The passage of people along such routes, where they have been made through formally secluded and undisturbed areas, reduces the diversity of the environment available to the wildlife. This has a particularly adverse effect on birds such as the Nightingale during the nesting season.

It was decided to provide lightweight posts and wire in four locations, with informative signs explaining the purpose behind this action.



After a year, the situation is that whilst most support the efforts to protect the environment, there appear to be a few who are determined to continue to use the routes recently created, and therefore trample on and kill the young plants that were starting to re-establish themselves. This behaviour is assisted by those few who are repeatedly damaging the protective fences and signs. Any thoughts on the way forward?


The Under 13 team have a similar transition as they move to 11-a-side, and the Under 9 team go to 7-a-side, so it is all change.

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West Bergholt Allotments

By the time you read this, the majority of crops will be harvested for this year and preparation will be underway for the next growing season. The plots have looked great this year and plot holders should be proud of themselves.

Changes have taken place this year to how plots are measured. The rent year has also moved to 1st October - 31st September, instead of April to March. Plot holders will receive invoices at the end August/early September, and this year only will include the 6 months period between 1st April to 31st September 2017. Payments must be made by 1st October.

Between the months of April to October, an allotment bonfire is scheduled on the first Tuesday of each month. In November, the last bonfire of the year is on 5th to coincide with Guy Fawkes' celebrations. Dates and times for the remaining 2017 growing season are:

5th September & 3rd October, 6pm – 8pm 5th November, 4pm – 6pm

Whilst every effort on the allotment is undertaken to recycle generated waste, diseased waste cannot be recycled. To minimise exposure to rodents, this waste is burnt. Every effort is made to ensure the fire is maintained within the guidelines laid down, whilst seeking to minimise disruption or inconvenience to the residential community. Due to shortage manure farmers and stables. of from local and increased transport costs. we would encourage plot holders to compost more.

Those of you that walk up New Church road will have seen the paved area at the entrance to the allotments, which, by September, should have a wooden shelter on it. This is the new covered area for the charity stall and will also double up as a shelter for plot holders in the event of bad weather. I would like to thank all those that have supported the stall.

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Changes to Route 66

As you may have seen on the West Bergholt website, First Essex are making changes to local bus services, including Route 66, that will affect West Bergholt.

By the time this edition of the Bulletin reaches you, the changes would have come into effect from the 27th August. Both the 66 and 66A will be combined to form a 20-minute frequency service. The changes to route 66, operating West Bergholt to Rowhedge end to end, will improve the service to the outer ends of the route. The 66A journeys and section of route via Speedwell Road, Abbotts Road and Barnhall will be withdrawn.

The Sunday ECC tendered journeys between Colchester and West Bergholt will depart five minutes later, to improve the punctuality of the service. Buses are currently timed to leave Osbourne Street at 45 minutes past each hour from 0945 to 2145. They will instead depart five minutes later, at 50 minutes past each hour from 0950 until 2150 service.
