With planned seating for the outside come summer, a morning menu – including pastries! – and the idea of ice cream for the children, there is definitely a lot to keep an eye on over the next few months.

# West Bergholt Local History Group

Our Autumn season opened with a talk by local author and historian Ken Free on Camp 186 the WW2 POW camp in Berechurch Hall Road.

The camp opened in September 1944 and at its peak housed over 6000 German soldiers, mostly 'other ranks'. Initially, the camp consisted only of bell tents for accommodation, which during the winter was cold and wet, with the area soon turning into a quagmire. As the Allies advanced and captured more and more prisoners, the camp was enlarged with more substantial buildings.

Many of the prisoners were put to work on the land, and Ken has clear memories seeing them working in the fields. Ken also recalled seeing German soldiers being marched by armed guards to the Headgate Congregational Church for a Christmas service, and during the service signing 'Silent Night' in German. When the war was over, he remembers his parents inviting some of the prisoners to their home for Sunday tea. It took around two years to repatriate all the POW's, although a few did decide to stay in Britain. After the last of the prisoners had left, the camp became the Military Corrective Training Centre. Ken's book 'Camp 186' is available from the library and all good booksellers.



Our October talk was about the Essex County Hospital and was given by Doctor Casale, who was a consultant anaesthetist at the hospital for 30 years. The hospital dates from pre-Victorian times, the foundation stone being laid by Lord Braybrooke in 1819.



Dr Casale's fascinating talk told of how the hospital developed over the years, and from his description of some of the treatments in the past made most of the audience very glad to be alive today. Although the hospital only ever had eight wards, doctors were often heard to say that they were going to 'Ward Nine'. Dr Casale revealed that this was the doctors code name for the Hospital Arms public house!

The West Bergholt Local History Group meets on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday in the month at the Orpen Hall starting at 7.30. Visitors and potential new members are always welcome.

# Friends of St Mary's Old Church



After the rather hectic fundraising efforts, which culminated in a Antiques Roadshow type valuation day, the Friends have rather relaxed to await the work on the building to be completed. The scaffolding went up at the beginning of October and now the building is shrouded in steel and plastic. The scaffolders were perturbed to find a large hornet's nest in

the roof, which had to be disposed of before their work could be completed.

We now await the main contractors who will sort out the leaking roof and repairs to the Belfry. The resident bats continue to give cause for concern and some new homes are being put in the surrounding trees in an effort to persuade them to relocate. Time will tell if the bijou new residences will be to their taste.

At the time of writing, the Friends are not aware of any completion date, which is impacting on the customary festive arrangements. At this stage, the Village Carol service looks to be under threat, as does the display of Christmas trees which we normally arrange. If the building works are finished soon then things may change. We will notify changes via social media and publicity.

The internal redecoration is planned for the spring next year, we are told. We are already receiving enquires for weddings for next year, which will hopefully take place in a much-improved environment. We also hope to progress the matter of some form of lighting within the building, which will enhance the use of the building by making evening events possible throughout the year.

## West Bergholt Allotments

Another year is coming to an end, and plot holders will now be busy getting plots ready for 2018. We have had a good year on the site, with changes to measuring of plots from rods to square metres, and the plot rent period now October to September.

The charity stall has raised approx. £4,250, nearly £2,000 more than last year! By the time you read this, the stall will have closed till April 2018.

The agreed recipients will be:

- 5Ts, £1,600 for a Christmas meal and pantomime visit;
- £800 to Toddlers group;
- £800 to the Church Wired group;
- £100 West Bergholt Fete;
- £950 to be retained.

 $\pounds$ 374 of the  $\pounds$ 540 grant we received earlier this year was spent on the stall structure. We appreciated all the help we received in the way of materials and the work involved in the building of the shelter. Also, a big thank you to Mervyn and his team for all the work and time spent on making this a success.

I would like to thank all those that have supported the stall by giving or buying produce etc. The Allotments Committee are now looking for beneficiaries for 2018. If you are or know of a local organisation, submit your written request to Terry Claydon, either via the Parish Clerk or email to <u>wballotments@gmail.com</u>.

The Allotments Committee has recently formed a 'Seed Club', offering members a discount off seeds from <u>Moles</u> <u>Seeds</u> (Turkey Cock Lane, Stanway). Membership is currently available to members of the Gardening Club, as well as Allotment Holders. If you don't have a membership card let us know.

We are currently getting the rents in for the period October 2017 to September 2018. Therefore, we may have some plots available if rents are not renewed. Please let me know if you are interested in a plot and I will add you to our waiting list (we currently have 2 on the list).

The ongoing replacement of water taps/tanks should be completed by the first quarter of 2018, and it will mean that all tanks will be self-filling, with only 1 tap on site. I would ask plot holders not to wash produce or tools in the tanks. Buckets will be provided by each tank for this. No water cans/containers which have contained weed killer should be used to take water from tanks. Don't let children play around the tanks.

**Open Gardens & Allotments 2018** will take place on 1st July 2018 from 11.30am to 5.30pm. The organising committee are looking for more gardens to be involved, and also for any clubs, special interests etc; e.g. model railways, vintage cars. It was agreed that the allotments would participate as before. Donations received will go to The Tom Bowdidge Foundation and Essex Air Ambulance.

## Supporting teenagers and young people with cancer

As you read this, we are now fast approaching Christmas: Tom's Christmas tree has been lit at the White Hart, Christmas Fayres are at their peak and here at The Tom Bowdidge Foundation, we are reflecting on another very successful year raising money for teenagers and young people with cancer.

The West Bergholt community has continually shown phenomenal support towards the charity and for that we will always be grateful. Your generosity has allowed us to complete some incredible projects this year that have made such a difference to these young cancer patients. Back in May we officially opened three rooms at Colchester General Hospital. These included a treatment room in the Mary Barron suite, a Quiet space in the Outpatients department where young people and their families can have often difficult conversations in private with consultants. The final room was a private room on the ward which has been beautifully decorated with a young and vibrant feel. It includes a Smart TV and a foldaway bed so that a family member can stay with their teenager.

Tom was treated in University College Hospital on a teenage cancer ward which was amazing. It was always his concern that as he approached 19 he would have to move from this ward to a ward for 20-25-year olds that didn't cater for young people in the same way. He had planned to change this ward somehow to make it young people friendly. Sadly, he didn't see this happen, but we are thrilled to report that the Tom Bowdidge Foundation has funded £35,000 to create a recreation room where the young patients will have a purpose to leave their bed or room to 'hang out' together and share experiences or entertain their family and friends. This project is due to be completed at the end of January 2018 and we cannot wait to share the finished project with you.

The Tom Bowdidge Foundation has granted over £30,000 to individual patients who need help with a variety of things, ranging from a new mattress to help with travel costs, to a new laptop to allow them to continue their university studies whilst in isolation. These are just a few of the ways that YOUR money has helped to make a difference.

Our commitment to research is as strong as ever and we have continued our funding this year to the cost of £84,000. We shall report on the amazing strides being made by our researcher Dr Chris Milton at the Institute of Cancer Research early next year.
