

100th Anniversary of the Orpen Hall

In this modern era whereby our village envelope is, it seems, to be under more and more pressure for space, it seems timely to reflect on the areas of the village that are historically protected by the Parish Council's governance as trustees of five charities held by them on our behalf, namely The Poor's field, The Village Green, The Allotments, Thomas Lorkin Daniell Playing Field and Orpen Memorial Hall. Many villages up and down the country have a designated 'Poor field', to which the poor of a village where granted the right to grow crops for their own use, although we enjoy ours now as an open playing field.

In this regard, two of these registered charities are, in fact, the direct result of a kind donation from forefathers of the village, of which Mr Thomas Lorkin Daniell and Mr Osmond Orpen, who were brothers-in-law, have helped shape village life. Indeed, Mr Orpen's donation occurred on 9th February 1918, just over 100 years ago. Although the existing Orpen Hall Complex was not opened until 1938, this kind donation made it possible, and some 80 years since opening, the Orpen Hall Complex plays a focal point in village life, and its many aspects are used from the very young – housing Bluebells pre-school – to the very mature, like the West Bergholt Social Club, which has been a tenant of the complex since its inception, albeit with a small break during the second world war when the complex was used as part of the war effort. Mr Orpen seems to have been a forward-thinking individual, as his will stipulated that should a 'parish hall' already be in existence then his donation was to be used to build cottages for the poor who were aged over 65 and had lived in the village for more than 20 years, a very generous bequest to the village, either way.



The West Bergholt Social Club has been run and maintained throughout this period by its own membership and is a fully licenced venue, offering SKY, BT Sports, snooker tables and a darts board, and is a welcoming family orientated venue which holds many social events throughout the year, from BBQ's, prize bingo to family fun days using the Thomas Lorkin Daniell Playing Field to expand its footprint to allow for bouncy castle's and such like, all with the kind permission of the trustees, namely your parish councillors. The Thomas Lorkin Daniell field is used by West Bergholt Football Club and is adjacent to the Orpen Memorial Hall Complex, which also has been expanded since 1938 with the addition of the John Lampon Hall at the rear. Many events and clubs meet at the complex and the variety of and spectrum of these events ranges from indoor bowls, Orpen Players, youth club and visiting local and nationwide speakers. 



The band's 40th anniversary commemorations started big-style with November's schools concert at St Luke's, Tiptree, featuring a massed band of over 75 musicians performing a top-draw concert of all styles of music - Shostakovich to Lady Gaga, and everything in between. That concert was followed by a magical Christmas Concert at St Peter's in Coggeshall, with the combination of a beautiful church, the wonderful music of Christmas, and a carol-singing audience resulting in a lovely warm festive atmosphere, and evoking memories of our Christmas concerts in St Mary the Virgin, when the audience used to squeeze together to fit into the pews.

The start of 2018 means we're now officially in our 40th anniversary year, so it seemed fitting that our

40th celebrations should start at the venue which has the longest association with the band, Clacton's West Cliff Theatre. Some of my earliest memories of the band are of our concerts there back in the 1980s, and it was the West Cliff that hosted the memorial concert when the band's founder, Sid Cooper, passed away in 1990. As with that memorial concert, this year's concert will be raising money for St Helena Hospice, and we're hoping the concert will take us past £40,000 raised for charities in the last dozen or so years. All of this year's concerts feature the best music from throughout the band's 40 years, with the "Big Bands to Bolero" concert at the West Cliff, including music from Sousa, James Bond, The Beatles, Broadway, and Disney, as well as those in the title. Come along and help us celebrate our 40th anniversary and raise money for a great cause - Sunday 11th March at 3pm.





After that we'll be starting our summer concerts with a return to Flatford on Sunday June 10th at 2:30pm for some more "Music by the Mill". Last year's concert was blessed with beautiful sunny weather and a large and appreciative audience, so we're looking forward to another wonderful summery afternoon of music this year... but more of that next time.





The West Bergholt History group

The West Bergholt History group held a special event in November, a Memorial Lecture to remember Bernard Colbron, who passed away in October 2016. Bernard had been the long-time chairman of the group, as well as giving much of his time supporting many other aspects of village life, including

the Bulletin editor for 13 years, serving on the Parish Council, and an Orpen Hall administrator.

The group felt that it would be fitting to remember Bernard by means of an annual memorial lecture. The first lecture, "The Life and Times of the Eastern Counties Railway", the story of how Colchester got the train, was given by group member, Peter Jones. Peter and Bernard had been close friends for over 35 years, and Bernard had actually supplied Peter some of the research material that he used in the talk.



The lecture was given to an audience of 45 and told of how the intention was to build a railway between London and Norwich but had to stop at Colchester because the company was bankrupt. The reason that North Station was built so far out of town was because the land was cheaper!



The Eastern Counties Railway soon acquired the reputation of being the clown of the industry, none more so than on Christmas Eve 1848, when a porter left two barrels of gunpowder on an adjacent track where it was run over by a train. The explosion lifted the engine completely off the rails, shattered 48 panes of glass in the nearby Albert Hotel, and blew all the beer glasses off the shelves!

The Railway also had a reputation for slow, late and overcrowded trains, which, through its metamorphosis into the Great Eastern Railway, London North Eastern Railway, British Railways and Abellio Greater Anglia, it seems unable to shake off! The lecture was well

received, as was the Prosecco and nibbles afterwards!

January Meeting, Archive Night

For our first meeting of 2018, WBLHG Chairman Peter Noakes gave a very interesting talk, "West Bergholt: Local history from our Archives". After the talk, members and visitors got the chance to look through some of the documents, maps and pictures from our collection.



One interesting item bought in by a member of the audience was a cutting from a newspaper, showing some of the staff from Daniell's Brewery.

What was incredible was that the length of service of these men ranged from 25 to 50 years making a grand total of 553 years. However, the cutting is not


