The Plan seeks to shape the village in setting out where new homes should go, their type, size and what they should look like, and how the open spaces around the village will be protected until 2033

You can vote in the John Lampon Hall between 7am & 10pm

If you are on the electoral register you can vote either in person at the Orpen Memorial Hall or by postal vote, if previously arranged, and if at least 51% of those of you that vote support the Plan then it will be used by Colchester Borough Council when determining all future planning applications in West Bergholt.

The Plan seeks to shape the village in setting out where new homes should go, their type, size and what they should look like, and how the countryside and open spaces of the village should be protected until 2033! Your Neighbourhood Plan seeks to preserve the unique characteristics of West Bergholt whilst welcoming development, improvements and change that seek to ensure the vibrancy of the community into the future.

It has taken six years for the Plan to reach this momentous stage with village consultations throughout that time in which many of you have taken part. To date the Plan (even when not quite completed) has been used by both the Parish Council and Colchester Borough Council this year in defeating the planning application behind the White Hart and those to the rear and south of Truman's Brewery! Both Councils also used the Plan in the planning appeal on Gladman's site off Colchester Road. The result of this appeal due before the referendum is therefore awaited by the West Bergholt Steering Group with very great interest.

You can read the Plan on **www.westbergholt.net** and hard copies can also be seen in local shops from 1st September. Those of you who have followed the Plan through its development may note the subtle changes suggested by the Examiner which the Steering Group have adopted and where policies have been enhanced and additional supporting text provided.

So, please vote to adopt the Plan on 19th September 2019. You can vote in the Orpen Memorial Hall between 7am & 10pm. Be sure your vote counts!

The history group started the spring/summer visits with an outing in April to Little Easton, near Dunmow where we had a tour and a talk on "The Forgotten Gardens of Easton Lodge". These gardens are Grade 11 listed and have been partially restored by volunteers and the owners of Warwick House. This is an ongoing project. May saw the group at Ipswich Transport Museum where Martin Long told us the history of trams and buses that operated to and from Ipswich. East Essex Aviation Museum housed in the Martello Tower at Point Clear, St. Osyth was our destination in June, the remains of two crashed aircraft can be found here along with memorabilia and displays of uniforms and guns. Our next trip in July was to Gainsborough House Museum in Sudbury, the birthplace of Thomas Gainsborough in 1723, artist famous for his portraits and rural landscapes.





The ash dieback effect

Ash dieback is a fungal disease, originally from Asia, which is lethal to Europe's native ash trees. It was first found in Britain in 2012 and is expected to kill 95-99% of ash trees in Britain. And, as around 30% of the trees in Hillhouse Wood are ash, that's a problem for us!

Young trees are particularly vulnerable and die quickly once they succumb whilst older trees can be slowly killed by a yearly cycle of infection. This means some of the more mature trees may take time to succumb and will continue to be vital habitats for various species and provide significant benefits to their surrounding environment. Therefore, it's only when infected trees pose a safety risk that they require pruning or felling.

So, we have the situation in Hillhouse Wood of the Woodland Trust monitoring the spread of ash dieback and the effect on the ash tree population. This means that they know when they will have to arrange for certain trees to be felled to keep people safe. Therefore, if you see one or more mature trees being cut down, you'll know the reason for it!

There is no doubt that the effect of this disease will significantly change the look and nature of the Wood over time. Whilst there is little we can do to alter this outcome, the range of species of tree that are to replace the ash will need to be given careful consideration.

Caring for our Churchyard at the New Church in West Bergholt

West Bergholt parish church is fortunate to still have a churchyard open for burials. But an 'open' churchyard brings with it responsibilities for its care and appearance. We're very grateful to everyone who undertakes regular maintenance, particularly the families of deceased relatives, who tend the individual graves so lovingly and carefully.

What may not be realised is that the way the churchyard looks and what we can and cannot do within it isn't governed by the church. It's governed by a set of standards and rules which come from the Chelmsford Diocese. St Mary's Church has responsibility for the maintenance of the churchyard. We need to do things in a certain way to ensure it meets these standards. These may differ from public cemeteries. A full copy of the churchyard regulations, and an additional local leaflet can both be seen on the parish church website at www.stmaryswestbergholt.co.uk

These regulations extend to how the graves are kept; a very personal matter for everyone involved. The way families wish to commemorate their deceased relatives is often highly personal and very important. Sometimes, however, this can conflict with the Diocese standards. This is why I'm offering this article to help explain some of these requirements.

Only fresh flowers or stems should be placed on graves. Plastic or artificial flowers are not permitted except for wreaths, or for two weeks on the anniversary of the person who has died.

Grave kerbs are not allowed these days. Over the years, they deteriorate, break and partially or wholly sink into the ground, becoming a hazard and creating difficulty for those maintaining the churchyard with modern equipment. It's welcomed when families volunteer to remove kerbs from older memorials. Chippings and stones within kerbs also create hazards for modern equipment and can cause damage if thrown by vandals. It has therefore been the practice for many years not to allow chippings, stones or glass beads within existing kerbs or on graves.


Even more sensitive can be the personal items people wish to leave on graves. We try to be as understanding as possible, particularly in the first weeks and months after a funeral, but personal items such as photographs, toys, lights and ornaments are not allowed on graves in the longer term.

I am very sorry for the pain we caused when we tidied up the churchyard earlier in the year; it was not my, or anyone else's, intention to do this. This article is the first step to provide information and an explanation to families with graves in the churchyard, as to what is and is not permitted.

Before any further tidying up of the graves is undertaken, notice will be given in the Village Bulletin and on the parish and parish church websites.

Our churchyard is a place of beauty and calm in the middle of our village for people to rest in peace and for people to visit. We are so fortunate to have this wonderful space, and I hope we can all work together to preserve it.

about broad beans in their "blankety beds". Our singing time is usually around 11am so we sang a few more songs in the sunshine rather than in the hall.


