### "West Bergholt Oil Purchasing Co-operative"

We have been approached to see if there is sufficient interest in the village to run an oil purchasing co-operative, as is successfully run by other rural communities. There is also interest in Eight Ash Green, which could most likely help us here.

As we all know utility bills are rising again (typically as winter is approaching!), but oil prices in particular have rocketed over the past year. It would make sense if residents could order fuel for delivery to the village in one combined delivery reducing the cost, hopefully significantly for all, also making it more environmentally friendly delivery-wise, and traffic-wise less heavy lorries travelling to and from the village.

West Bergholt is quite a spread out village and residents especially on the outskirts, have no choice but to use oil to heat their homes. After being caught behind large oil delivery lorries a number of times in the village negotiating the smaller lanes, I was thinking it would make sense for oil users in the village to work together for these mutual benefits, and was wondering if there was anyone else in the village who would be interested in starting an oil purchasing co-operative.

#### Safety on Footpaths in winter - Volunteers wanted

During the ice and snow of last winter many people had difficulty going out because of the hazardous conditions. The Parish Council has organised for all necessary salt bags and equipment to be available to keep certain pavement areas and footways safer.

Following our request for volunteers in the last Bulletin only two residents offered their help, which was disappointing. More offers of help would be appreciated. Priority areas have been identified:-

School/Heathland approaches; Orpen Hall areas; Co-op approaches; Bus stop areas; Unpaved roads; Doctors' surgery approach paths.

### Little Ducks Singing Group

Little Ducks is an established, and very successful music group, who have recently moved to West Bergholt. Sessions take place at St Marys Church Hall and they welcome any parents/carers with pre-school age children to join. They are also very happy to have any older siblings in school holidays for the same price.

The group is based entirely on sharing nursery rhymes, action songs and percussion music. This fun, interactive and very noisy session promotes all areas of learning and hopefully gives parents lots of ideas to carry on the music making at home! As well as having lots of fun, nursery rhymes are great for language development - they have a lot of rhythm which catches the children's attention and repetition, which is good for speech development. It is important in sessions that the children not only enjoy being part of a lively group but actively participate in the music making and tidying away. The group's aim is to get all the parents and children, no matter how small, moving to the beat and playing with simple musical instruments and colourful finger puppets.

Research shows that children who are actively involved in music (who play or sing it regularly) do better in reading and maths when they start school and are better able to focus and control their bodies, play better with others and have higher self esteem. These are really important influences when Little Ducks structure and rework the group which happens every term. They are always looking to add new material to their session and like to involve children and parents in this process as it is a group for all ages! It is also really important that children are able to add their favourite songs and really get involved in the group.

The group will run for an hour and spends around 40 minutes on different musical activities. These involve finger puppets, musical instruments, beanbags, dancing and other rhythmical activities. They have found at their existing group that the children love the variety on offer with something for everyone. They finish the session with drinks and snacks and a time for friendships to be formed and old ones to be strengthened.

Running every Friday morning from 10.30-11.30am, the cost is £3 per family. This price includes a healthy yummy snack and drink for the children and a cuppa for the parents/carers. Little Ducks try to run through all school holidays where we are able to use the hall facilities but this is always subject to change. It is always lovely to welcome new faces so if you fancy a morning of lively, energetic, fun they would love to welcome any new faces who fancy giving Little Ducks a try.

### Proposed Expansion of Heathlands Primary School

Thank you to the many parents and local residents of West Bergholt who visited Heathlands on October 4th to view the plans for the proposed expansion of our school. The Local Authority received 48 written responses to the proposals which were as follows:

Yes, I fully support the plans	19	40%
Yes, I generally support the plans,		
but have some concerns	20	42%
No, I do not support these plans	4	8%
No recorded response (1 e-mailed)	5	10%
Total	48	100%

Whilst the majority of responses were in support of the plans, concerns were raised particularly with regards to the increased traffic congestion and parking problems. Essex Local Authority works with schools across the county, as do all Local Authorities nationally, to support them in different approaches to reducing dependency on the car in journeys to school. The normal approach to begin with is for the school to complete their own 'School Travel Plan'. Heathlands School currently has a 'School Travel Plan' which has been compiled after extensive consultations with all parents/carers responsible for getting children to schools. The main objective is to encourage a review of how they personally achieve this and their mode of transport used, if any.

In preparation for the proposed expansion, Heathlands will be updating its travel plan, and will undertake 'journeys to school' consultations again. The information from this and feedback from the consultation will enable us to evaluate the current impact of journeys to and from school. This, we also hope will refresh consideration given to the alternatives to using the car, particularly for those who live in the village, and hopefully improve the current situation.

Discussions are also taking place between our school and the Parish Council to look at possible solutions to easing traffic congestion in the village.

### First Responders



The village's First Responder group has undergone some changes in the

last six months. Several new members have joined the group including Terry Hardy, a recently retired IT specialist and motorbike enthusiast and Michelle Wakeling who works fulltime in London. (both pictured) Terry and Michelle, along with our other new members, are looking forward to



supporting the community by providing vital medical standby support. We also have a new support worker, provided by the Ambulance Service, who has joined us for several of our evening meetings and updates the group on news and techniques.

At the October meeting a more advanced "Resusci Anne" was brought along so Responders could practice chest compressions to ensure the right depth of pressure was being achieved in line with new medical guidelines. Regular practical time at meetings helps build the volunteers confidence should they choose to respond to a call when on the rota. As it happens, call outs in the village are quite rare which reinforces the message that volunteering is not a time consuming activity (but so valuable when a call out does occur).

Many Responder groups regularly recruit home workers or employees from local businesses to be on their rotas, however, so far the uptake of people who work in West Bergholt has been poor. If you work from home regularly, occasionally, or are part of a business in the village why not enquire about supporting the First Responders during your working day? After the initial weekend training your commitment to being on a rota can be as little as 4 hours a month. Also remember you can carry on with whatever you're doing whilst on the rota, it's only should an emergency call occur that you will be asked if you are free to respond. Being a Responder is a great way to integrate into and support your community as well as providing you with excellent life skills.

# West Bergholt Parent, Baby and Toddler Group

The Baby and Toddler Group meets every Monday morning during term time from 9.15am-11.30am in the Methodist Church Hall on Chapel Lane. Children from birth to five years old are able to play and meet other little ones with their parents/carers in a friendly and relaxed atmosphere.

There is a variety of toys including a kitchen, garage, train set, dollies and prams, ride-ons, a slide, see-saws and much much more. Coffee/tea and juice and biscuits are served at 10am by our lovely volunteer tea ladies. To round off the morning we have a singing session with our dedicated singing lady who uses a treasure chest, musical instruments and a parachute to entertain the children (and carers). This proves a really nice way to round off the morning's activities. We regularly do craft activities with the children – recent craft tables have included apple stamping, making a leaf and twig collage and leaf rubbing. Forthcoming craft will include halloween masks, and Christmas decorations. The children also regularly do colouring in and play doh.

Stall holders including Usborne books, Phoenix cards, Little Red Nest Gifts and Fire your Imagination (decorating pottery) regularly come and have a stall at the group. This ensures a regular retail experience for the parents/carers and a 10% donation to playgroup funds from all sales made.

Regular 'prambles' occur to the Bluebell Woods and to the orchard as well as an annual teddy bears picnic and sponsored walk to Orpen Hall park. We also hold a summer and Christmas party for the children to enjoy! Every half term the parents/carers meet for a drink at the Treble Tile – which is nice to get to know the other parents/carers in a social environment.

This summer we raised £115 from the bake sale at the teddy bear's picnic and the name the teddy competition at the summer party. This money was donated to the Special Care Baby Unit at Colchester General Hospital.

The group is run entirely by volunteers from the tea ladies to the committee members. All funds raised from the weekly charge and membership fee are used to keep the group going and to buy additional toys as and when required.

There is a small weekly charge of £1 per family and if you want to become a member your child will receive a hand delivered birthday card, an Easter egg and a Christmas present from Father Christmas himself for a small annual fee of £5.

Sacks have been found in Pirie Road and on the Lorkin Daniel Field.

The dumping of sacks is illegal. On finding these sacks it may be reported to CBC and they may approach the 'owners' of the sacks.
