


The Derby Midshipman Band from Derby (Two Performances),

Monday 4th June - Diamond Jubilee Evening of Music from 7pm

An evening of music and celebrations will be held on the Lorkin Daniell field and in the Orpen Hall. West Bergholt Concert Band will open the evening with 60 years of music that will culminate in the classic Pomp and Circumstance. Weather permitting this will be an open-air event on the playing field so bring your gazebos, canvas chairs, flags and party wear. A full bar will be available, or bring your own. Following this rousing musical will be a full Hog Roast dinner which will lead into our second act of music by a dance band in the village hall.



West Bergholt will host one of 2,012 Beacons to be lit world-wide on the evening of the 4th June. Your Parish Council registered with the royal jubilee celebration organisers and our village appears on the web site for this event at www.diamondjubileebeacons.co.uk.

Adrian Leach, a village resident, volunteered to manufacture our village beacon at no charge and this will take pride of place both at the Music Evening and later when it will be mounted alongside the village sign in Colchester Road.



West Bergholt has been allocated 10.15pm as the time to light our beacon. This is just before Her Majesty lights the main Beacon in London at 10.30pm. Don't worry you won't miss the London event as it will be shown live by a video stream using our high speed village broadband service in our halls. You can even bring your iPad or Tablet for a personal table top viewing.

The evening will also mark the formal opening of the Bergholt Youth Shelter on the playing field. The shelter will be made by another local craftsman, Ian Dickson. The shelter will be opened by a local dignitary who for years has helped many communities fulfil vital projects throughout Essex.

Entry to the concert and dance band will be free, however a charge of £3.50 per head will apply for the hog roast dinner for tickets purchased in advance. For catering planning tickets will be restricted to a maximum of 120 and will be available from Heathlands School, Bluebells and our shops.

The formal celebrations will conclude with a firework display on the field



Saturday 16th June - Diamond Jubilee Family Fun Day from noon

This family fun day aims to bring together the entire community young and old – children, parents and grandparents alike. The event brings together the organisational skills of our School PTA, our award winning Play School group Bluebells, Parish Council, WI, Youth Group, Scouts, churches and other organisations and clubs that make our village a special place in which to live.



The events start at 12 noon with our village children mounted on their jubilee decorative scooters, three wheelers or small bikes forming a parade that will assemble in front of Heathlands school before parading through the village to the Lorkin Daniel field. All children taking part will have their decorative “rides” judged by a panel and prizes awarded to the winners.



This will be followed by a celebratory tea party for all children on the Lorkin Daniel field where as well as the usual treats they will receive a diamond jubilee party pack.

Traditional village family games and events encouraging all to take part and compete in a family fun way during the afternoon. Youth activities will be co-ordinated by our Bergholt Youth Group and Football Club who plan all kinds of entertainment for the occasion.

There will also be a bouncy castle and play slide, fete stalls, music and donkey rides, all focussed on the fun and family sport arena at the centre of the playing field. The village History Group and Scouts will have displays. The WI will be selecting the best entry to a Diamond Jubilee competition for a card designed by a local child. A suitable verse written by an adult will also be selected to complement the card design and the winning combination will be professionally produced and sent to the Queen from West Bergholt.

The fun day will be the main funding generation event for both the PTA and Bluebells so please be generous and assist these excellent village organisations.

Entry to the family fun day will be free, however tickets for the children’s tea party will be 50p per child available from Bluebells and Heathlands School.



Come along, have fun and at the same time support your local organisations.

Please note dogs are not permitted on the Lorkin Daniell field at any time and in particular during the period of these two events.

As soon as a drought was announced you knew it was the start of the Cricket season and we would have a month of non-stop rain! At the time of writing the pitch is under water and our first few games have already been lost to the weather. Despite this we are looking forward to a full and promising season.



The 2012 season promises a busy schedule for all of our teams, from the Kwik Cricketers through to the Senior Sides. Junior Cricket has gone from strength to strength over the past few seasons with our membership approaching 60 strong. Last year's U13 side, under the leadership of Trevor Rogers, won the NECL 1st Division and gained promotion to the U14 Premier League this season, with the U11's finishing as runners up in theirs. 
