



Children's Play Area, Lorkin Daniell Field

For some time, the Parish Council has been concerned about the level of recreation provision for children in the village and in 2018 took the decision to renovate and upgrade the Play Area of the Lorkin Daniell Field. The whole project could cost in the region of £50,000 so funding sources had to be found and the development spread over a number of years. An Advisory Group, consisting mainly of the parents of users, representatives of the School and Bluebells, and a small number of Parish Councillors was formed and consultations on preferred changes to the area and favourite equipment took place.

A phased plan was produced which involved renovating old equipment, replacing that which was worn out and ensuring that appropriate safety surfaces were in place. Before Covid restrictions halted further progress, a Snake Swing and Nest Swing were installed. These have proved very popular and brought more children to the site.

Background informal consultations have continued on a Phase 3 and recently more formal soundings have established that an Aerial Runway is the main item on the wanted list and with the funding available, plans are being made to install one in the Spring in time for opening at the Platinum Jubilee celebrations. This fills a gap in providing for children of a slightly older age, as well as those from aged 5 (even Bluebells might use it under supervision!).

The Trust has decided to offer a contract to PlayQuip who installed the earlier equipment to our satisfaction. The equipment which has been inspected and tried out at Bures Play area, is of good quality and has a sound attenuation mechanism and a feature which minimises operational noise.

Children will be excited by this innovation but once established, experience of other providers is that they will create no more noise than when using any other piece of our equipment. All planning requirements and safety and legal liabilities will be met.

A location parallel to the tennis courts and 3m from it, starting at the Youth Shelter has been selected. This does not overlap with the football pitch but in order to meet the conditions needed for spectator safety, the football pitch will be rotated slightly from the corner nearest to the John Lampon Hall and the Aerial Runway will be closed for use during match times. The Trust is appreciative of the help and support it has received from the Football Club in implementing this plan. This position reduces the risk from children running across its path and minimises the impact on all parties who might be affected by this project.

The Charity Stall is closed for the winter but will reopen at the end of March, hopefully with a bumper crop of rhubarb.

We are all looking forward to a successful new season and a great harvest this year.

Herby spring chicken pot pie

Minimise your washing-up with this delicious one-pan chicken pie with spinach and herbs and topped with crispy filo pastry. It's ideal for busy weeknights.

Ingredients

2 tbsp olive oil , plus a little extra for brushing over the pastry

bunch spring onions, sliced into 3cm pieces

250g frozen spinach

6 ready-cooked chicken thighs (or see tip, below)

350ml hot chicken stock

½ tbsp wholegrain mustard

200g frozen peas

200ml half-fat crème fraîche

½ small bunch tarragon , leaves finely chopped

small bunch parsley, finely chopped 270g pack filo pastry



STEP 1

Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Heat the oil in a large, shallow casserole dish on a medium heat. Add the spring onions and fry for 3 mins, then stir through the frozen spinach and cook for 2 mins or until it's starting to wilt. Remove the skin from the chicken and discard. Shred the chicken off the bone and into the pan, and discard the bones. Stir through the stock and mustard. Bring to a simmer and cook, uncovered, for 5-10 mins.

STEP 2

Stir in the peas, crème fraîche and herbs, then remove from the heat. Scrunch the filo pastry sheets over the mixture, brush with a little oil and bake for 15-20 mins or until golden brown.

First taster night is free then £5 each week you attend. We meet at St Mary's Church, New Church Road, West Bergholt, 7pm until 8.45pm.




