

#### Vandalism in the community

It was sad to see that the village has suffered several acts of mindless vandalism over the past few months.

There was malicious damage to the gazebo on the Orpen Field, as well as to the Bluebell Preschool's flower beds, where stones were left all over the ground and field. Staff had to clear the area before the children could be allowed outside for safety reasons.

Luckily, there is a quality CCTV system at the Orpen Hall and the guilty parties were caught very

clearly, allowing the matter to be handed over to the police for criminal damage.

A short time later, the allotment sheds were broken into and a fire started in the grounds of St Mary's Church. This was particularly dangerous given the very dry weather conditions and could have caused much larger fires if they had got out of hand, putting houses and other buildings and residents at risk.

Any suspicious activity in the village should be reported to the police.

#### Our Neighbourhood Plan

You'll have seen a few political flyers come through your doors on the security of West Bergholt's Neighbourhood Plan.

Be assured though that with the adoption of Section 2 of the Colchester Borough's Local Plan on 4th July 2022, it's even more secure, and policy SS15 in CBCs Local Plan (see below) enshrines the NP as the determining planning document as far as new housing is concerned. Those who recall the somewhat irrationality of the Inspector in order to grant approval to the NEEB site off of Armoury Road will be pleased to learn that as a result of the PC work that the Local Plan in its final version now says:

"6.227 The West Bergholt Neighbourhood Plan was made in 2019. It sets out the planning policy framework needed to support the delivery of 120 houses to 2033 and to guide and meet all other development or community needs identified by the community in West Bergholt.

Policy SS15: West Bergholt: All development proposals in West Bergholt parish will be determined against and be required to comply with policies in the West Bergholt Neighbourhood Plan and any relevant Local Plan policies."

#### Say NO! To 180km of pylons

You may be aware, but there's a planning application in for the new large Pylon route.

#### What's the problem?

National Grid call this proposal 'East Anglia GREEN', because it is transporting green energy! However, the pylons are intrusive, destroy our historic landscapes and will require huge loss of trees.

Worse still, National Grid have published their own research that shows an offshore grid would save consumers upto £6bn. So it's not a secret National Grid obviously know this, OFGEM know this and the Government know this - so why is this even being considered?

National Grid's idea of 'GREEN':


- 180km of 400kV overhead cables

They enjoyed a walk around, seeing if they could spot all the different types of plants, but the main interest seemed to be the different insects they found! It was encouraging to hear how many of them had family with allotments where they enjoyed helping out so the next generation of allotmenteers is here already! The Open gardens event was a great success, with a lot of people coming to admire the allotments -it even inspired someone to apply for one!

Hull strawberries and blend all ingredients, except the honey, together until smooth.

Pour into a glass, stir in the honey and decorate with strawberry slices.

#### Letter to the editor...

An update on the works at West Bergholt Doctors Surgery.

I am a member of the Practice Patient Group (PPG) at WB. I do not work for them, but I have been asked to provide an update from the Patients perspective on the progress at WB and I am happy to do so.

Let's start off by stating the obvious that the building work took too long, I think the complications of such a major project during the winter months and whilst Covid was affecting everyone were underestimated. Every time I have made something or decorated something it took longer than I hoped, so I end up very impressed with the end result they have achieved – Well done!

The surgery re-opened 27th June using the Creffield Medical Group (CMG) telephone hub to route calls for all 3 practices. Sadly the days of small practices, with a doctor who you have known for many years are gone. CMG has over 28,000 patients and Colchester is growing on a daily basis, with 920 new houses being built each year. The GP surgeries are having to change to meet the demands. To give a consistent high standard of service across the group, it was decided to centralise the telephone staff and appointments system, whilst allowing patients to choose the most convenient location to visit.

There is over 105 staff on the books and there are at least 10 people answering telephone calls at 8.00am. When you call, you will probably be in a queue, but as there are 10 taking those calls, the queue moves reasonably quickly. It is so much better when you get answered straight away, but everyone phones at 8.00am, especially after a bank holiday, which is why CMG are asking patients to call

at certain times i.e. prescription queries after 11.00am, to spread the load and improve answer times. A telephone hub approach helps smooth the peaks and troughs. CMG can and do look at all the hub information regarding numbers in the telephone queue etc, and are actively trying to give the best service possible.

Something that will reduce the number of people phoning up is to persuade people to use the various websites that are available. I don't think the CMG website is very friendly (I think it's a NHS generic offering, not CMG) and it's not easy to find things, so I am pleased to know they are working on an easy to use 1 page guide with links to all the popular services they offer. Some people cannot use the Internet and the telephone hub will be there to help them. I have seen the hub staff in action and they are keen to provide a quality service – let's support them, not just moan on social media, without offering a solution.

In a Daily Mail online article dated 20th June 2022 entitled "Death of the local GP surgery", our region was rated in the top segment for Face-to-Face appointments. CMG offer Face-To-Face, but I don't object to video calls when appropriate. I don't have to waste time and I can't catch anything - the trouble with doctor's surgeries is they are full of sick people. Try and find the article, it's a bit of an eye opener.

So going back to the start, its open, its surprisingly large with I think over 12 treatment rooms which are modern and well equipped. My guess is there wasn't much change out of £1,000,000 and I thank Creffield Medical Group for their investment in our area.

If you disagree with anything I have written, don't moan at CMG and I'm not on social media, but you can join and support your PPG.

In front of the Orpen Memorial Hall, four ornamental pear trees replaced the diseased ornamental cherries originally planted for her Majesty's Coronation. These trees have been sponsored by Oak View Landscapes, WB Allotment Association, WB Gardeners' Association, and the Parish Council.

On the Poor's Land, two Pin Oaks were donated by the Mayor of Colchester, with a tree planting ceremony taking place with children and staff from Heathlands School in late May.

Two trees were also planted by the children's playground on the Lorkin Daniell Field and were donated by Scissorhands Hairdressers and Tree & Lawn Company.

The focal point of the celebrations was the Jubilee Festival, which took place on Saturday 4th June. The afternoon of entertainment included fete stalls, inflatables, a DJ and performances by live bands, as well as food provided in the form of hog roast, BBQ and pizza stalls. The new zip wire play equipment was also opened during the festival and has been well used and enjoyed by children since then.

Inside the Orpen Memorial Hall, tea and cakes were available with a free afternoon tea provided to those aged 70 or over by Bluebells Pre-School.

Other activities such as U11's football and cricket skills sessions, a tennis competition, a performance by the Vocal Zones choir and a Trampette taster session took place. 
per person or £5 for a family, and all proceeds will go towards our project to upgrade the church hall.

#### Dog poo on the Lorkin Daniell Field

Dog fouling is a major and increasing concern to many people on the Lorkin Daniel Field, not just because of the mess it causes, but because it can be a health risk. Did you know dogs deposit roundworm eggs in their faeces, which become infectious (and can remain so for up to 2 years!), and particularly children run the risk of picking up infections. Possible symptoms range from aches, dizziness and nausea to asthma and pneumonia. Not pleasant!

You will all have seen the signs banning dogs from the field, whether coming onto the field from Mumford Close or through either entrance at the front of the Hall, the photographs being a reminder! In fact, there has been an order on the field for decades banning dogs.

Indeed, by the time you read this article, you'll have seen Colchester Borough Council's 'dog warden' on the field as owners are required to clear up after their dogs in public areas. Those who fail to do so can get a fixed penalty charge of £100 or a court fine of up to £1000.

The solution is simple, keep your dogs off the Lorkin Daniell Field please.

#### Why West Bergholt's 1,000-yearold church always needs a little extra support

Many (but not all) village residents will be aware that the oldest building in West Bergholt is the magnificent, historically significant St Mary's Old Church in Hall Road (next to Bergholt Hall and directly on the popular walking route to Hill House wood.)

Since Saxon times, the old church has played a pivotal role in local family events but ceased to be the village's principal church when the new St Mary's took over in 1904.

The ancient church sank into decline and in 1974 the responsibility for its upkeep passed into the hands of the Churches Conservative Trust (CCT). Its brief is to safeguard the fabric of the old St. Mary's and ensure its continued existence as a part of Britain's heritage and village life. In the last 4 years, the CCT has repaired the roof and dormer windows and, with the help of a generous legacy from Mrs Yvonne Henderson and a fundraising effort by West Bergholt friends, it has redecorated the interior of the church - the last part of which has just been finished.

A dedicated group of local people the Friends of St. Mary's Old Church -hold special events through the year to raise funds to help keep the church open and well appointed. The group is planning events from September to Christmas 2022:

- Sunday 18th September National Heritage Week. The church will be open to visitors from 10am 4pm who can take a tour, learn about old \$t Mary's history, and indulge in free refreshments. Donations welcomed.
- Saturday 8th October Quiz Night at the Orpen Hall with Ploughman's supper and bar. £5 per person. Tickets available at fosmoevents@icloud.com.
- Sunday 27th November Mulled wine and Mince Pies at the Old Church to meet up and renew/enrol for annual membership (£5 fee per household). No booking necessary.

The Friends are always looking to welcome new members of all ages who have a bit of time to spare and can see the importance and value of this historic and symbolic building. Membership forms are in the Old Church for those who would like to join, or online at the web page below.

The church is open every day between 10am - 4pm and all visitors are welcome. St. Mary's is still a consecrated church and can hold up to four services per year. Weddings, vow renewals and funerals can also be arranged to take place in the church.
