How is it nearly 2023 already?



Chocolate Christmas biscuits

These easy chocolate biscuits are the perfect Christmas treat that both kids and adults will love.

Prep:30 mins Cook:10 mins

Ingredients

270g plain flour 50g cocoa powder 120g icing sugar 150g butter 2 eggs

For decoration

melted chocolate, piping icing, sugar pearls, sprinkles

Method

STEP 1

Mix the flour, cocoa, icing sugar and a pinch of salt in a bowl. Rub in the butter and then mix in eggs. Knead quickly with your hands to a smooth dough. Wrap in foil, press into a flat disc and chill for 30 minutes.

STEP 2

Heat the oven to 180C/fan 160C/gas 4. Line a couple of baking sheets with baking parchment. Roll out the pastry on a lightly floured worksurface to about 3mm thin. Cut out shapes from the dough. Put the biscuits on the baking sheets – it's best to put similarly sized cookies together. Bake for 7-10 minutes, depending on the size of the biscuits.

STEP 3

Knead the off-cuts of the dough together and chill again for 15 minutes. Roll, cut and bake as before. Cool completely.

STEP 4

When cooled, the cookies can be decorated with chocolate or icing and sugar pearls and sprinkles.

SESAW

That silly chihuahua gave me the best laugh I've had in ages! He was boasting about 'writing' Kenny's SESAW News since 2012. That's a decade to you and me – but he never admits to being more than eight years old! He can't even get up on time since the clocks went back, so here's my cat's eye view of our news, starting with our first Christmas Fair since 2019!

SESAW takes in not only domestic animals but also wildlife casualties, including sick or injured hedgehogs found wandering

during the day. This year, the prolonged dry weather delayed their release into supported sites, so two hedgehogs passed the time by helping increase their numbers to eight! All are now living in suitable areas where our volunteers oversee their welfare.

Hedgehog numbers are falling but

humans can help by supplying drinking water and cat or dog food to eat; never bread and milk. They need gaps under fences to move between gardens and a pile of leaves and twigs to hide under - please check for 'Spike' before you build a bonfire. The British Hedgehog Preservation Society (www. britishhedgehogs.org.uk) and People's Trust for Endangered Species (www. ptes.org) provide very detailed help and advice on what you can do.

The evenings are drawing in and it's too cold to stay out but I always grumble when Mother scoops me up to go indoors each night. Anyone who thinks I'm a pushover doesn't know me.

HEATHLANDS SCHOOL – 3PR

3PR is a scheme devised and implemented by the North Essex Parking Partnership. The preference is for children to walk to school, cycle or use scooters where possible, but for those parents who have to use a car, the scheme offers advice and support.

Heathlands, supported by the Parish Council, has signed up to the scheme from the start of the Spring Term in January.

The elements of the scheme are:

3PR Parking Zone

An advisory no parking zone will be created outside the school based on an assessment to identify the zone. The 3PR Zone will be identified on a 3PR Parking Map and by lamppost signs throughout the zone.

3PR Parking Maps

Tailored maps will be created for the school and will highlight the 3PR Zone,

including pictures of the common parking problems that occur around the school (e.g. parking on zig zag

lines and double yellow lines at junctions).

Park and Stride

The scheme will identify suitable locations for parents to park their vehicles and walk the remainder of the way to school. This is great for exercise and will help reduce the number of cars near the school gates. Park and Strides can often help form a walking bus, which can increase walking numbers significantly.

3PR Schools receive extra parking enforcement at peak drop off/pick up times to encourage considerate parking.

On September 6th, members travelled for a Deben river cruise, which was enjoyed with perfect weather, followed by a lunch at the Maybush Inn.


The vice president took the September meeting and welcomed a new member. The speaker was Designer, Amanda Sutherland with her talk entitled 'My

We meet at St Marys Church Hall, West Bergholt, every Monday morning during term time between 9.30-11.15am.
