Members of the Royal family attending on the day included the Prince and Princess of Wales, the Duke and Duchess of Gloucester, The Duke and Duchess of Edinburgh and the Princess Royal.

On the day I had the good fortune to spend sometime chatting with HRH Prince of Wales, Prince William who asked me to convey his best wishes all those who actively volunteer their time in support of our community, whilst in addition to posing for the picture above for the Village Bulletin (L-R HRH Prince of Wales, Prince William, Graham Scott (Proprietor Lexden Executive Cars) and myself in the chair. Apart from HRH Princess of Wales, Princess Kate, I had the good fortune to meet and speak with all other members of the Royal Family attending.

In all, it was a most memorable occasion to represent my community and not something I had ever contemplated in my lifetime."

River Stour Trust

Spring is nearly here so what better way to celebrate than a visit to Constable Country and a boat trip on the river operated by members of the RST? A registered charity, run by volunteers, the Trust came into being over forty years ago when the then Anglian Water Authority attempted to remove navigation rights. The current major project for RST is the renovation of Dedham lock to bring it back into a working condition. This is a significant project requiring erosion protection as well as replacement of the lock gates.

So why not include a visit to Flatford, maybe just for a walk or take a trip on the river? Bring your family, your visitors, and yes, even your dog. Groups can also charter the boat for family and friends, outings or part of a birthday or other celebration.

What is in my Beebomb?

Beebombs are handmade in Dorset. Each pack contains hundreds of seeds and 18 species of wildflowers. The seeds are mixed with clay powder and locally sourced, unfortified soil. The clay supports and protects the seeds whilst they germinate and spreads them as it breaks down under watering.

Seedballs are an ancient method of farming that is less destructive to the wildlife buried in your garden, less labour intensive and increases germination rates.


BYG


The King's representative in Essex joins the West Bergholt Annual Parish Meeting

West Bergholt Parish Council hosted the Annual Parish Meeting on Wednesday 26 th April 2023 in the local Orpen Memorial Hall and were honoured to welcome His Majesty's Lord Lieutenant of Essex Mrs Jennifer Tolhurst. She is the first woman to be appointed to the office in the county since it was established in the 1500s, and she is His Majesty the King's personal representative in Essex.

Cllr. Brian Butcher, Chair of West Bergholt Parish Council welcomed His Majesty's Lord Lieutenant to the village, and to the Annual Parish Meeting, along with the Parish Council and the local residents.

Whilst at the meeting HM Lord Lieutenant unveiled a print of a portrait by local artist Richard Stone of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. Also on display was a cross stitch celebration of the King's Coronation by lifelong resident Eileen Brown. The meeting was very well attended and along with other guest speakers from Anti-Essex Pylons Campaigner Rosie Pearson, three Essex Police Representatives of Colchester's Community Policing Team, and Roger Smith from Essex & amp; Herts Air Ambulance, the evening was deemed a great success.


