You'll most probably know the Parish Council, its Planning Committee and Environment Committees meet nearly every month throughout the year, but did you know all their minutes are on westbergholt.org and the Council meetings are open to all members of the public, to which you're all cordially invited?The Parish Council also manages as sole trustee, and is also responsible for meeting the rules of the Charity Commission, the Orpen Memorial Hall Trust, the Poors Land Trust, the New Allotments Trust, the Lorkin Daniell Field and the Village Green Trust.

### Last year's achievements

There is not enough space in this Bulletin to tell you all that the Parish Council has achieved in the last year, but some of the fruits of our labours many of you will have seen around the village, including the zip wire on the Lorkin Daniell Field, the trees planted to the front of the Orpen Memorial Hall, the Lorkin Daniell and the Poors Land, the refurbishing of floors in the Orpen and John Lampon Hall, guizzes raising funds for the Red Cross Ukraine appeal, and all-inclusive play equipment on the Lorkin Daniell Field. Who can also forget the Jubilee Festival, with its free afternoon teas, the Spitfire flypast and of course the live music in the evening.

### Getting funding

The Parish Council is always applying for grants and to a large extent the activities above were funded from grants received, such from the National Lottery Community Fund to aid the payment of Jubilee Festival costs, from the Essex County Council Climate Action Challenge Fund to fund 85% of the costs of solar panels, which you'll not see as they are only accessible from the centre of the Orpen Hall roof (hoping as I write in January they will indeed be in place by the time you read this article), and from Enovert Community Trust £50,000 of funding to upgrade the toilets within the Social Club, as well as building now to the rear for a disabled accessible toilet and baby changing facilities.

### Day to day stuff

The majority of the day to day running costs for the Parish Council come via Colchester City Council, who collect via their Council tax demands the Villages's precept. This year, as we are all experiencing, costs are rising across the board and so with slight salary increases but primarily because of notable increases in tax, pension and national insurance contributions the Parish Council will be asking Colchester City Council for an increase of an average 32p per month per West Bergholt household for the next financial year. The Council's full budget for this year and last year's auditing accounts can readily be viewed on westbergholt. org, and if you've any queries please do email those to westbergholtpc@ gmail.com

### ECC Highways funding

Unfortunately we have had one set back during the year! Due to the removal of a grant from Essex County Council in the last few months, you'll have seen little of the Council's handymen working on minor repairs to the highways around the village. We had been working with ECC on Highway Devolution projects for months, but without any notice it was terminated in April, but the Parish Council wasn't informed until September! That meant six month's work without reimbursement working on ECC assets removing dangerous branches, hedge trimming, street sign cleaning, spraying weeds, litter picking, grass cutting, etc. However, with the Council's excellent record of works, it didn't take long to put together a bill, which ECC nearly paid by return! Moving forward though a meeting should already have been had with ECC by the time you read this to sort out how we get back to doing this work. Watch this space!



#### **Coming shortly**

So to wrap up this brief run through, I thank you for your time and look forward to seeing you all at the Annual Parish meeting on 26th April 2023 in the Orpen Memorial Hall, when I hope you'll hear not only from your Parish Councillors but from the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner and Lord Lieutenant of Essex, both of whom have been invited to attend. Further inducements if needed will include free wine, beer and nibbles, with tea, coffee and biscuits!

### West Bergholt Dog Walking Code of Conduct 2023

You'll probably remember reading my pleas in the Autumn to keep your dogs off the Lorkin Daniel Field, which most dog owners have kindly heeded.

However, the Parish Council have thought it would be prudent to put in place a code of practice for dog walkers to cover all the green spaces West Bergholt Parish Council manage.



The Parish Council welcomes responsible dog owners to use their green spaces, but in the interests of all users of the facilities, the Council asks that dog walkers adhere

to its Code of Conduct below, and remember that the facilities are used by others, particularly children.

The 'Code of Conduct' for dog walkers using land owned by the Parish Council as sole Trustee, i.e., the Lorkin Daniell Playing Field, Poor's Land, Village Green and New Allotments is:

#### Village Green

Well behaved dogs on short leads are permitted.

#### (New) Allotments

Plot holder's dogs only are permitted, they are to be kept on the lead at all times and should not be allowed roam on or foul other plot holders sites.

#### **Poors Land**

Well behaved dogs can be allowed off the lead, however:

• Put your dog on a lead if it fails to come back promptly on command

or if it has a tendency to chase wildlife.

- Keep your dog in sight,
   as a dog out of sight
   may be a dog out of control.
- Put your dog on a lead when approaching children, school groups, joggers or cyclists.

#### Lorkin Daniell Playing Field

NO DOGS are permitted on the Lorkin Daniell playing field.

#### All Green Spaces

• Clear up after your dog. Always make sure you have a suitable bag with you – BAG IT, BIN IT.

• Use the dog bins provided – there are approximately 21 dog bins in the parish.

 Make sure your dog has an ID collar on at all times.

• Don't assume that everyone likes dogs – many people are fearful of dogs. Under Colchester City Council Public Space Protection Orders (PSPO), dog owners are required to clear up after their dogs in publicly accessible areas. Failure to do this could result in a fixed penalty charge of £100 or a fine in court of up to £1,000.

# Parish councillors, elections and voter ID

West Bergholt Parish Council is fortunate to be an eleven seat council and currently has eleven sitting



councillors. However, on 4th May 2023 all eleven seats are up for re-election. To be a West Bergholt parish councillor you have to be a British or Commonwealth citizen, be at least eighteen years old and either registered to vote in West Bergholt or have lived here for a year. There are more reasons why you can't be councillor but the full eligibility criteria is available on the Electoral Commission website.

Whilst all elected councillors receive training to help them fulfil their roles. being a councillor is more about giving back to the community by bringing passion and energy, to seek to make a real difference to West Bergholt and wider society. So, if you fancy standing watch out for the Notice of Election from Colchester City Council with dates, nomination paper, advice, etc.

This year for the first time in the U K, all voters that attend the Polling Station,

being the Orpen Memorial Hall in West Bergholt, must have photo I D. Such can be your passport, driving licence, bus pass, etc, even if it's expired as long as it is still a suitable likeness. There is a full

list of the forms of photo I D that can be used on the Electoral Commission website.

Don't worry if you do not have photo I D because you can apply for a free Bring photo ID to vote

Voter Authority Certificate by visiting electoral commission.org.uk/voterID. All voters must show their photo ID to get a voting paper - no ID no vote - so please ensure you have one. There is no change to the way you can use postal votes. As to the reasons for photo I D the Elections Act 2022 introduced such, the parish council elections in May being the first since the legislation was given Royal Assent.

Of course, if only eleven people or less put themselves forward to be a West Bergholt Parish councillor there will be no election on the 4th May 2023 (between 0700 and 2200 at the Orpen Hall), but please do ensure you are registered to vote and have your photo ID ready as who knows when the next general election may be!
