# The Village Bulletin - Proposal for Changes

February 2024

### **Background**

The Village Bulletin is printed on a quarterly basis and is currently distributed to 1,488 properties in the West Bergholt Parish. It generally consists of 20-24 pages in full colour.

In previous years the Village Bulletin has managed to cover the majority of costs by advertising, however over the past 18 months with the increasing impact of inflation, print prices have increased and costs regularly are no longer covered. This has resulted in increasingly higher subsidies from the Parish Council.

A survey was carried out in 2023 to gauge how important the Village Bulletin was to the community; overwhelmingly it was considered a key source of information about village life and a key communication tool.

#### **Solutions**

The Bulletin Board has reviewed options to reduce costs:

- 1) Reduce the size and type of font (minor) so that more text can be added on each page and improve the layout this has already been implemented.
- 2) Reviewed other PC magazines looking at different formats including A5 and Colour v B&W.
- 3) Obtained 3 quotes for different formats (alongside the existing format)
  - a. Black and White
  - b. Colour Front/Inside Cover and main body Black and White
  - c. A5
- 4) Increase advertising costs by 2.5%:
