Questions are asked; truths are told; dirty washing is aired. Full of fun and pathos, this play is sure to please.



1st West Bergholt





West Bergholt Parish Council Update

Dear All,

By the time you get around to reading this part of the Bulletin you will have seen the leaflet inviting you to take a survey which the Parish Council is undertaking in respect of the Village Bulletin, and its way forward. Like everything, the cost of producing is going up and the Editorial Board have suggested a number of potential ways forward that they would like your views on. Please either complete the enclosed survey or complete online - the survey form tells you how to do both.

We continue to look for grants to undertake projects, in particular we have recently applied for £10,000 for inclusive play equipment of the Lorkin Daniell from the Hyperlocal fund and £25,000 from Rural England Prosperity fund for the proposed parish office/community hub. Both these projects have been the subject of previous grant applications to other funds, but unfortunately unsuccessfully! Fingers crossed for these applications.

We were, as you may recall though, successful in getting grant funding from Essex County Council for the solar panels on the roof of the Orpen Hall, and you can now see how successful the panels are by looking at the meter in the hall lobby, which shows the power generated/saved. The toilet facilities located in the Social Club have

been refurbished, by a grant from Enovert, and by the time you read this article the long awaited externally accessible toilet will be operational courtesy of \$106 monies. This facility is wheelchair accessible and has baby changing facilities, for the many families that use the field and playground.

Also by the time you read this, the Orpen Hall will have been redecorated and all the lights changed to LED lights, which will be more ecofriendly and sustainable. The change to LED is also grant funded, by the National Lottery. One thing that we doubt will be reinstated by the time you read this is the Highway Devolution agreement with ECC, under which our handymen were previously allowed to fix minor highway issues in West Bergholt, but we keep on their case!

The Parish Council was delighted this year to be invited to attend the annual competition day 10th June at Bounceability. You will all have seen their sign as you drive up from Colchester but few may know what it is. In simple terms it is a trampoline club for children and adults with any need or disability. It is an inspirational place to visit and the enthusiasm of the volunteers needs to be seen to be believed.

Similarly the Parish Council was invited to attend Heathlands School fete on 7th July and delighted the School raised over £5000

for School funds. Congratulations to all.


At this year's election for Parish Councillors, only ten people stood for election and so were returned unopposed. This gives the Parish Council the opportunity to coopt a councillor. A number of you have seen our advert for such as we have four villagers who have stepped forward and are now attending as observers of Parish Council and committee meetings. In September one of these four will be coopted onto the Council.

Just as this Bulletin comes out the Parish Council will be making its application to achieve Quality Gold Award status from the National Association of Local Councils, the standards are high but we hope to become only the second Parish Council in Essex to achieve, wish us

luck, it be a fantastic achievement and demonstration of the great work that everyone does.

Finally, an annual plea. If your hedge or tree overhangs a public footpath such that is causes an obstruction to pedestrians or reduces vehicle sight lines, please do cut back immediately to make our paths and roads easier for pedestrians and vehicles to use safely. If you have a ditch on your property, do not forget you are also responsible of clearing to ensure it does not cause flooding this winter, and so endangering pedestrians and vehicles
