I am often asked about how 'The Friends of Hillhouse Wood' came into being and when the Wood became available for everyone to walk around.

Well, it all started in 1993 when 34 acres of privately owned Hillhouse Wood was put up for sale. This was at a time when such pieces of woodland were being snapped up for possible commercial activities such as paintballing and motorcycle scrambling.

The Parish Council believed that such uses needed to be prevented but felt it was not the right body to take on the purchase and management of such a major asset. So Jon Lander, a prominent resident, contacted the Woodland Trust to see if they were interested in acquiring the wood. The Trust responded very positively by putting in a bid for the wood and launching a local appeal for funds, as well as putting £5000 towards the asking price of £34,000. Letters were distributed to all West Bergholt residents, inviting pledges of donations together with appeals through local papers, and six weeks later, on Christmas Eve 1993, the final donation of £1000 was sent to the Trust to make up the total required.

generous donation of £6000 from the then Colchester Borough Council.

In January 1994, the Trust wrote to all who had pledged donations, informing them that the target had been reached and that it was proceeding with the purchase of the wood and inviting them to a celebratory meeting in February 1994 in the Church Hall.

All those present were asked to indicate if they were prepared to act as voluntary wardens or engage in conservation work in the wood and many did so.

Towards the end of 1994, the Trust invited them all to a meeting to discuss the setting up of the 'Friends of Hillhouse Wood' to look after the wood in accordance with the Trust's work plans and so it was, on 5th January 1995, the first meeting of 'The Friends' was held, at which a committee was elected under Jon Lander's chairmanship. And interestingly, of the founding committee one members, Richard Chadborn, is still on that committee and continues to attend the working parties nearly 30 years on!

Bulletin Survey Results Highlights

Firstly, a big thank you to all of you that took the time to complete the Bulletin Survey, which was included in our Autumn edition as well as being shared on Social Media and available online. We were pleased that we had a cross section of the village respond by all methods.

We undertook the survey to understand the value of the Bulletin to the residents and to help evolve it to meet our needs and budgets. We are currently working through the feedback, particularly the ideas for evolving the Bulletin but wanted to give you an early insight into some of the key highlights.

We asked if you received a paper copy of the Village Bulletin and were delighted that the overwhelming majority 97.2% said yes. A big thank you to all the volunteers that make this possible.

It's all very well receiving it but, if people don't read it, it is a waste of time and money and so we asked the question if you read the Village Bulletin and again we were delighted that we had a very positive 81.7% said yes.

Again, trying to gauge the real value of the Bulletin to the village and whether the online version would be sufficient, we asked if it wasn't delivered to you would you miss it? A resounding 76% saying yes they would miss it.

Parking in West Bergholt

There aren't enough pages in the Bulletin to discuss the perennial parking problem hotspots but I thought it would be a good idea to remind ourselves of what the Highway Code says about parking. It says much more, but the most pertinent are:

If you have to stop on the roadside:

- do not park facing against the traffic flow
- stop as close as you can to the side
- do not stop too close to vehicles displaying a blue badge

You must not stop or park on;

• a pedestrian crossing, including the area marked by the zig-zag lines

You must not leave your vehicle or trailer in a dangerous position or where it causes any unnecessary obstruction of the road

DO NOT stop or park:

- near a school entrance
- anywhere you would prevent access for emergency services

- at or near a bus stop
- opposite or within 10 metres of a junction
- opposite a traffic island or another parked car
- where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users
- in front of an entrance to a property
- on a bend

Parking on the pavement can obstruct and seriously inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs or with visual impairments and people with prams and pushchairs.

You must not wait or park on yellow lines during the times of operation.

You must not wait or park, or stop to set down and pick up passengers on school entrance markings when signs indicate a prohibition.

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Sale of West Bergholt Methodist Church

The sale of the Church site was finally completed on Friday September 15th 2023. This has been a protracted and complex sale, which was not helped by the pandemic and subsequent lockdowns.

As many villagers will remember, the Methodist fellowship ceased to worship in September 2018. Sadly for some time, our membership at West Bergholt had been declining and we made the difficult decision to cease holding Sunday services in our Chapel. The remaining members transferred and now worship at "The Well Methodist Church", in Mile End.

Thesitethenbecametheresponsibility of the Methodist Church. The sale of the site was handled through the Colchester Methodist Circuit. The Methodist Church retains the ownership of the Bus Shelter site and the Burial Ground between the Hall and the Manse. This will remain open, and the existing reservations will be honoured. The area has been fenced and a new pedestrian public access provided from Chapel Lane, via a gate at the corner nearest the Manse. Public access remains in place for people to visit the graves of their loved ones.

We wish the new owner well with the site. It will be good to have such a significant site in the centre of the village in use again and we look forward to seeing what the new owner plans for the site.

Have you ever played rugby? Or does the idea of a fun outdoors activity appeal to you?

If so, then Walking Rugby could be just what you are looking for.

The Stanway U3A rugby group is over 5 years old now with a flourishing membership of players of all description. We have some ex-players, plenty more who never played, or only did once or twice at school, and, inspired no doubt by the magnificent England Red Roses Womens rugby team, a strong contingent of ladies who participate.

Even though we are in fine fettle, I am always looking to add to our playing pool, so especially if you have previously played, or have good hand eye ball skills, then why not give us a try? We hold sessions held at the sports pitch at Eight Ash Green, Wednesdays at 2pm.

Forget preconceptions of tackling, scrums and lineouts. Think fresh air, good physical exercise and plenty of fun added in. The rules are kept to a minimum; this helps with integrating new players into the group. Experience shows people easily adapt and learn the basics and can fully participate very quickly. Tip of the Season

It's not too late to plant tulips or allium bulbs!

If you plant them in late December/January (perhaps Father Christmas will bring you some!) they will flower in late April or into May. If you have passed through the main entrance to the Orpen Hall recently, you may well have seen a Display Monitor providing details of our answer.

Our problem

A 4-fold increase in electricity costs in September 2022. We needed to come up with a way of reducing our use of National Grid electricity, preferably without costing us much money, to help keep the running costs & hire charges of the Hall as low as possible.

Our proposal

To install a solar panel and battery system paid for by a grant.

Our answer

Even before we knew the full extent of the electricity increase, we were aware that our 2-year fixed rate deal would soon end, so we started getting quotes and looking around for potential grant sources earlier in 2022. We eventually came across Essex County Council's Climate Action Challenge Fund, which was established to inspire voluntary and community groups to develop projects which combat climate change. Whilst we seemed to meet their criteria, we were restricted to applying for a grant not exceeding £20,000.

Having obtained a quotation, we used it to make our application in September 2022, and were delighted to hear we were successful. Along with 40 other groups and organisations, we had benefitted from the Climate Action Challenge funding.

Unsurprisingly, the Contractors had plenty of work on and were suffering from shortages of materials. By February 2023, the main work had been completed, with the solar panels producing 'free' electricity for the Halls, either for immediate use or, when there is excess, to be stored in the batteries for future use that day or the next. Looking at the first four months, our National Grid use reduced by about 1160kWh compared to the same time last year. This equates to a reduction of around 33%, which is a saving of around £600. Whilst it took many months for the Display Monitor to be supplied by the manufacturers, it is now installed and providing information on the solar energy being produced. It's well worthwhile pausing for a minute to view the rolling screens.



So, how does this help you?

This project can help you both directly and indirectly. The project itself reduces the effect of the large increase in electricity costs on the Orpen and John Lampon Halls budget thus reducing upward pressure on what you pay to hire either hall.

It also provides an example of what can be achieved even in these tough times. It doesn't have to involve Solar Panels or Solar Batteries; it may just involve seeing if you can get some insulation installed in your home for free. So, why not look at possible opportunities on the following link:

COLCHESTER COLLECTABLES Buying

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Christmas Puddini Bonbons

INGREDIENTS

Serves: 30

- 125g best-quality dark chocolate (finely chopped)
- 350g cooked and cooled christmas pudding
- 6oml sherry/ brandy
- 2 tablespoons golden syrup

FOR THE DECORATION

- 100g white chocolate (finely chopped)
- 6 red glace cherries
- 6 green glace cherries (or 6 short lengths angelica)

METHOD

- 1. Line a baking sheet with foil or greaseproof paper.
- 2. Melt the dark chocolate in a heatproof bowl over a pan of simmering water, or in the microwave.
- 3. Crumble the cold Christmas pudding into a bowl, add your alcohol of choice and golden syrup and stir briskly till fully mixed.
- 4. Pour in the melted dark chocolate and stir again.
- 5. Pinch out small lumps of mixture and roll into little rounds about the size of a chocolate truffle. You should get about 30 out of this mixture.
- 6. Cover with clingfilm and slot into the fridge to firm.
- 7. To decorate, melt the white chocolate as above, then let it cool for about 5 minutes, to make it easier to work with. Chop the red cherries into small pieces and snip the green cherries (or angelica) into miniature lengths, to represent leaves.
- 8. Using a teaspoon, drip a little of the melted but slightly cooled white chocolate on each bonbon, then arrange the sticky pieces of cherry on top.
- 9. Place in boxes to give away if you use small boxes that will fit 6 bonbons each, you will get 5 adorable presents out of this — or on a plate to hand round with coffee, instead of dessert, after a post-Christmas dinner.
