
Essex, Suffolk, Norfolk Pylons Update

New year, new phase in the offshore grid campaign.

ESN's campaign petition call is: 'say no to pylons and say yes to an offshore grid'. An offshore grid is better, faster and cheaper.

By integrating the grid offshore and pooling the electricity, you reduce the overall infrastructure required by 50%. That makes far more sense than the approach employed by National Grid, in which each wind farm and inter connector is offered a separate onshore connection (miles inland).

An offshore grid would be faster to implement because there would be fewer planning applications and fewer angry locals to contend with. This is what we are arguing for - keep the power offshore for as long as possible, pool it and bring it onshore at fewer, consolidated sites:



Operator (ESO) is at long last carrying out its review. Several from the Essex Suffolk Norfolk Pylons campaign group have attended their round tables. ESO is fully independent from NG Electricity Transmission (the one wanting to build pylons).

The formal remit of ESO's review is much too narrow. It is only looking at scenarios involving Norwich to Tilbury Pylons, Sea Link, North Falls and Five Estuaries. The reason for this is that Government's Offshore Coordination Support announcement only included the latter three!

It is far from ideal because the offshore benefits cited above come from maximum integration, not from cherry picking. Yes, we want Five Estuaries and North Falls connecting offshore but as part of the big picture.

The key omission in the review for the West Bergholt area is Tarchon, an inter connector offered at Ardleigh. For as long as Tarchon connects there, the pylons project remains alive and kicking. Our argument for some time has been that Tarchon should connect further south and that Five Estuaries and North Falls should connect into Tarchon.

Aside from Tarchon, the ESO review ignores the other twelve or so wind farm projects in planning in the North Sea. These need to be integrated. Informally, we have been told by ESO that they are in fact also analysing our offshore grid proposal.

Final pylons consultation

In the meantime, we know that NG ET will launch its final pylons consultation as soon as it can after the ESO review. That ends 9th March. Thank you to all those of you who support our campaign.

I do hope as many people as possible responded to the Essex County Council Bus Network Consultation in the autumn in respect of its support for the local bus services. The Parish Council public transport rep did!

The outcome, 375 pages, has finally been published, decisions taken, and a procurement process is now underway for providers, with the outcome of that expected to be known in Spring 2024.

The important bit is S3 will remain a supported service for 2024. Time will tell though if by the summer it will be with First Essex Buses Ltd!

A drop-in cafe for young people

Several years ago, residents identified in a consultation questionnaire the need to prioritise improving the provision for the young people of our village.

Since then, several initiatives, such as establishment of the Youth Group (BYG) and the provision of more play equipment, including the Zip Wire, have taken place.

The Parish Council feels this is still an area for further development and so has established a Youth Engagement Working Group consisting of four Councillors.

Our first task has been to review the existing youth organisations we have in the village, ranging from Scouts and Guides to the Church Youth Group and BYG. It is good to see that all are thriving and providing excellent service for our young people. As well as this, members of the Parish Council have termly meetings with the Headteacher at Heathlands School and this is leading to regular joint projects with the school Eco Council.

The meetings of the above youth groups are weekly to monthly and do seem to leave a gap for some of our older secondary school pupils. Through discussions with them and their leaders and parents, the biggest need is to establish a venue where they can meet regularly and socialise, possibly with friends who attend different schools, at the end of the school day.

The experience of the weekly 'warm welcome space' has shown that the meeting room at the Orpen Hall Social Club can be utilised as such a venue. Discussions have now taken place with the YMCA and they are able to provide a professional Youth Worker to lead this project. A Café here can provide for around twenty at a time.

The proposal is to open the Café for those of secondary school age (i.e. Year 7 upwards), initially once a week from 4.00 to 6.00pm, starting from the start of the Autumn term in September. We believe that this is an opportunity to support our young people, which will in turn benefit the whole village.

If you feel able to help, we will be pleased to hear from you. The leader will need the support of adult volunteers, both to be a presence with the young people and to manage the café. Others will be needed to form a management team to run the project.


West Bergholt Development Update
