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Bergholt Youth Group Needs Your Help!

Fifteen years ago, West Bergholt had only limited opportunities for the young people of the village. After consultations with some of the older secondary school pupils, BYG was established and a team of committed parents formed a management group. The aim was to provide a supervised meeting place with opportunities to take part in leisure activities, both indoors and out, and to socialise with friends. The Parish Council provided the venue at the Orpen Hall and financial assistance to get started.

BYG has grown to provide social activities for around a hundred 10 to 13 year olds on a fortnightly basis. This requires considerable organisation and they now need more volunteers to keep running. Two of the original members, Jamie Bowden and Matt Slark, have been club leaders and together with a dedicated committee and team of volunteer parents, have seen the club grow and prosper.

However, the club has been a victim of its own success and for BYG to continue, more volunteers are now required, including people prepared to be a part of the organising committee. So, do you have the enthusiasm and practical ideas on the way forward to ensure BYG can survive?

The current success of BYG is in no small part due to the dedicated team who have overseen its management for the last seven years. The outstanding contributions of Jamie and Matt have been supported by a committed chairman, secretary and treasurer. As a result the finances are sound and others in the team oversee safeguarding issues, the co-ordination of volunteers and membership.

Of late there has been no shortage of volunteers, but as with any such organisation such commitment has a limited life span and planning succession is a big challenge. This time has now arrived for BYG and it is time for a new team to come forward. The foundation from which to start is strong and will be underwritten by the support of the Parish Council, which will continue to provide advice, and access to its facilities as needed.

West Bergholt's Annual Parish Meeting

A short article on the meeting on 24th April for those that were unable to attend. To those that did, again many thanks. There were very few spare seats!

Displays around the Hall by Friends of Hillhouse Wood, WB Gardeners' Association, Vocal Zones Choir, Church Youth Group, West Bergholt 1st Scouts, and a flower display by the Colne Valley Flower Club were all well received. These were added to by displays by the PC on its achievements over the last year, and the accounts of its five Charitable Trusts.

There is not enough space here to list what the PC has achieved over the last year, but I can tell you its ambitions for the next twelve months:

- An after-school Drop-in Cafe on Wednesday's in term time;
- The transfer to us of the 3-acre William Sims Sports Field;
- The construction of the WB Community Hub to the JL Hall;
- The building of a servery and accessible WC on the Poors Land:
- An increase in use of the MUGA and increased hours of availability;
- A new online booking system for the MUGA/tennis courts;
- A refreshed Bulletin;
- An update of the Neighbourhood Plan;
- A successful Local Council Award Scheme gold application;
- The setting up of 'Cycling West Bergholt' Working Party
- A Rural Community Award for village hall of the year;
- 600m squared of wildflowers, the Bee Squared project, in our front gardens;
- ECC to agree to a zebra crossing on Colchester Road!

The first speaker was Mrs Pam Donnelly, CEO of Colchester City Council, on the trials, tribulations and pleasures of running the City Council.

This was followed by the presentation of

the PC's 2023-24 Grant Certificates to the Friends of St Mary's Old Church and BYG. The sensory dark den, used exclusively by Bluebells bought by in part from funds from the Village Charity Quiz, was also there for all to see.

The second speaker was Lieutenant Colonel Ed Rankin, Colchester Garrison Commander, on the trials, tribulations and pleasures of running the Garrison!

The nominated Volunteer of the Year was Philip McNeill, who has been a stalwart of West Bergholt Scouts for over 25 years. Philip was presented with a framed bespoke certificate by the Garrison Commander.

Questions from the floor and a plea for help running BYG rounded off a very successful evening.

Unfortunately they had just sprouted through the soil when the weather turned colder again and they got frost damaged! No doubt they'll recover in time but it just shows you need to keep an eye on things growing and cover them if necessary.

The allotments are looking good (with a very few exceptions) and at present the site is still full. However, if you want to go on the waiting list, just email your name, address and phone number to westbergholtallotments@gmail. com.

After the inspections, a few plots become available, so it is worth registering your interest in a plot. If you are giving up a plot, please make sure you take away anything you have brought on site so the area is left clear for the next person to take on.

The Charity stall is now up and running again.

Donations of gardening related items are very welcome (but no electricals please). The money raised by the stall has helped sponsor the winter-themed photography competition held for the first time this year for under 12 and under 18's. We have also donated funds to the Bee Squared project to purchase seeds for distribution through the school and the church. The idea is that you sow a packet of the provided wildflower seed in your garden (or in pots if you have no spare space) to help pollinators flourish. As numbers of insects and bees particularly are going down, anything we can do to help them is worthwhile.

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Making West Bergholt a Bonfire Smoke-Free Zone

During COVID and the desire for everyone to experience fresh air in the village, the Parish Council's support of recognising a climate emergency, and with the lead taken by the Allotments Committee in ending bonfires to dispose of their green waste, West Bergholt is now close to being a bonfire smoke free zone, in fact no more than a handful of residents now have one occasionally.

Why is it important and what are the options? The impact on your own health and that of your neighbours such as respiratory problems, asthma, COPD or long COVID has to be a primary concern. A better option is using the the services of CCC to dispose of your waste. There are also many locally

based waste disposal firms for confidential waste disposal, etc.

Did you also know that burning anything other than dry garden refuse, having a fire on damp windless days, in the evening or at sunset, and one that results in smoke blowing over neighbours properties can result in action by CCC.

So, in anticipation, thank you for seeking to ensure West Bergholt is bonfire free zone!

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Solar Panels & Storage Batteries - Are they right for me?

Following West Bergholt Parish Council declaring a 'Climate Emergency', a Working Party was established to identify activities that could be undertaken. In its bid to engage with the local community, the Working Party investigated what schemes were being undertaken locally and nationally.

One such scheme provides the opportunity for residents to obtain Solar Panels and Storage Batteries without any upfront costs. Whilst neither the Working Party nor West Bergholt Parish Council recommend any scheme, website or business, they try to provide sources for anyone interested to take a look at and make up their own minds.

This scheme is provided by Essex Community Energy (ECE) which was set up by the social enterprise Power Circle Projects Ltd with support from Essex County Council. It will provide a pay-as-you-go option where the hardware remains in the ownership of ECE, but with the household purchasing solar

energy at an affordable rate while buying their remaining energy requirement from a retail supplier as normal. As an alternative, there will also be a customer-funded option.

As there will be very many questions (such as 'what happens if I want to move home?' and 'how much will it actually cost me each month?), the Climate Emergency Working Party is enabling Power Circle Projects Ltd to hold a public event in the Orpen Memorial Hall in the next couple of months.

1st West Bergholt Scout Group

We run sections at the Scout Hut: a Beaver Colony (for 6 to 8 years old), two Cub Packs (for 8 to 10½ years old) and a Scout Troop (for $10\frac{1}{2}$ to $14\frac{1}{2}$ years old). We have just over 80 boys and girls in the sections, meeting most weeks during term-time. We are fully behind The Scout Association's drive to prepare young people with skills for life but with a bias towards "outdoors" and "adventure": in the last two years, we have hiked, camped, tried kayaking, sailing, scuba diving, archery, rifle shooting and more. But we also attend St George's Day and Remembrance Sunday events. Not surprisingly, Scouting is very popular and we are having to run a waiting list for Beavers.

Our young people have worked hard to achieve the highest awards in each of the age groups, the Chief Scout Awards, and we have awarded 8 Bronze Awards (for Beavers) and 4 Silver Awards (for Cubs). The Gold Award (for Scouts) has been earned

by Eve Carey, Luke Hersey and Charlie Leek and all three are now helping as Young Leaders.

It was really pleasing that Philip McNeill, our treasurer for 27 years (but also our skills instructor and "maintenance man"), was recognised for his service to the group by being named as West Bergholt's Volunteer of the Year.

Our activities can only take place through volunteers supporting our group, either as uniform leaders or as trustees and we really need more adults to come forward.
