Lorkin Daniell Field - A dog free zone Dog faeces is dangerous



It is frustrating to continue to see some dog owners ignore the rules that seek to keep our community safe and clean.

Just a reminder - DOGS

ARE NOT ALLOWED on the Lorkin Daniell Field at any time.

Unfortunately some dog owners ignore this advice and also allow them to foul the field, ignoring how everyday children play on the Field.

WHY is the Field a dog free zone? Dog faeces can be dangerous for children because it can contain parasites that can cause infections:

• **Toxocara worms:** These roundworm eggs can be found in dog faeces and can cause toxocariasis, a parasitic infection.



Children are more likely to contract toxocariasis because they often put their hands in their mouths and may not wash them well enough. Symptoms include eye damage, which can lead to blindness.

• **E. coli and hepatitis:** Dogs can carry these in their faeces.

• Hookworms, ringworms, and tapeworms: These parasites can be found in dog faeces and can be passed on to children.

Please note, if your child comes into contact with dog faeces, you should wash them, especially their mouth, teeth, and fingernails. You should also give them some water to drink and keep an eye on them. If they vomit or have bloody stools or diapers, you should call your doctor.

First of all, thank you to everyone who provided items for the Charity stall which were passed on to others for donations in the Charity box. It is only through your generosity that we could award grants to several local groups to allow them to improve their facilities. This year, money from the Charity Stall supported The Parent and Toddler group, 5T's (a club for older people), Heathlands school for equipment for their Forest School and St Mary's Church for flowers at Christmas and Easter.

1st West Bergholt Scout Group

We held our AGM on Friday 27th September and we were pleased to welcome Brian Butcher and Laura Walkingshaw from the Parish Council. Gavin Birchall (Chair), Sarah Sanderson (Secretary) and Philip McNeill (Treasurer) were all re-elected, as were the other members of the Trustee Board: we are grateful for their service to the Group. We were delighted to receive a grant of £500 from the Parish Council towards the training of our volunteer leaders: the Parish Council's support is really appreciated.

After the short meeting, we were entertained by Ben from Spirit of the Wild UK, who brought a selection of animals from his zoo. We were shown – and, in some cases, held – a skunk, a snake, a barn owl, some meerkats and lots more; our young people really enjoyed this hands-on lesson in exotic wildlife!

As the weather since the Summer has been good, we have been able to spend more time than usual outside and the Beaver Scouts have been around the village and practised the Green Cross Code and collected natural materials to create pictures and bug hotels. The Cub Packs have hiked from Chappel and then slept over in the Hut and undertaken a number of activity badges: Communicator (involving tracking, codes and reporting), Entertainer (with attempts at developing plays and puppet shows), Money Skills (learning about exchange rates) and Naturalist (with several visits to Hill House Wood). The Scouts have also been very active and, in addition to the Pioneer Skills Activity Badge, have practised

their culinary skills, had a Survival Skills Camp (with no tent allowed – please do not ask about Harvest Mites!) and have hiked from Manningtree, followed by a sleepover.

Since the start of the academic year, two of our Cubs have been awarded their Chief Scout Silver Awards: congratulations to Louis Lam and Isaac Addington. We have been able to introduce nine youngsters to Scouting, too. A number of youngsters have moved up to the next section and have settled in well.

As usual, we will mark Remembrance Sunday in the village at St Mary's Church on 10th November. Also, as we have for a number of years, we will be collecting gifts for homeless men at the City's shelter and women and children spending Christmas at the local refuge. Although currently unplanned, I am sure we will have our own Christmas celebrations, too.

As always, Scouting is very popular currently and we are having to run a waiting list for Beavers but, with more volunteers, we could eliminate the waiting list. All of the activities only take place through volunteers supporting our Group, either as uniform leaders or as trustees and we really need more adults to come forward.
