



## West Bergholt Parish Council Update

Dear All,

By the time you read this we hope you will see the roof on the WB Community Hub, its completion imminent, and opening before the next Bulletin!

In the foundations we have buried a time capsule containing photos, information about the village, money (which let's face it might not even exist when it's opened!), etc, to give those that open it in decades to come a glimpse of life in 2025.

Something the capsule readers will discover is that Richard and Nikki Bowdidge have been awarded MBEs for their dedication to the foundation set up in their son Tom's name. Congratulations to both on behalf of all the village.

Two new Parish Councillors have also joined the PC, Veronique Tyler and William Pigeon, both of whom you will probably know already from their village businesses. We welcome both and look forward to working with you.

We hope you will have seen the new inclusive roundabout in the Lorkin Daniel playground, funded by \$106 monies (from house building) and a donation from Bluebells from monies raised at last year's Fete.

The balance was funded from the ringfenced Parish Council's NP Implementation Plan fund, the 24/25 PC Projects budget and the Lorkin Daniell Field Charitable Trust.

We would just take this opportunity also to let you know the precept (council tax) the parish council has requested from Colchester City Council will be going up in the spring by 6p a week. Like all tiers of government, we have to follow prescribed pay scales, but unlike all other levels of government, parish councils have not been offered any relief from the Chancellors' increase to National Insurance! To keep to this minimal increase we have reduced our project and grants budget to £14,000, but

rest assured we have maintained the same level of grants we make available to local groups.

One date for your diary is this year's Annual Parish Meeting, which will be held on Wednesday 23rd April in the Orpen Memorial Hall. We cannot announce the names of the speakers as they have not confirmed yet, but it is always a great opportunity to have your say, so please come and ask your parish council questions.

After the Annual Meeting, Thursday 8th May will see 2025 marking 80 years of Victory In Europe. A commemorative event will be marked in West Bergholt, as over the rest of the country, by holding events around the lighting of the beacon on the Lorkin Daniell field. Please look for event advertising nearer the time.

One thing we are certain about, with great anger and regret, is any progress by Essex County Council on constructing a safe means of crossing and speed reduction measures on Colchester Road. Our latest communication from ECC is an apology that there has not been a comprehensive review following our petition submission in October! Disappointing to say the least.

Finally, please also note the logo at the top of the page. WB Parish Council has been awarded the Gold award in the Local Council Award Scheme, currently the only parish council in Essex to hold this level!

Solar Panels and Storage Batteries – are they right for me?

Showcase Event at the Orpen Memorial Hall

Wednesday 12th March 2025

Doors open 7pm for 7:30pm start

It was mentioned last year that a public event would take place in the Orpen Memorial Hall to provide information on a scheme that provides the opportunity for residents to obtain Solar Panels and Storage Batteries without any upfront costs.

The scheme in this case is provided by Essex Community Energy (ECE) which was set up with support from Essex County Council. It will provide a pay-as-you-go option where the hardware remains in the ownership of ECE, but with the household purchasing solar energy at an affordable rate while buying their remaining energy requirement from a retail supplier as normal.

As an alternative, there will also be a customer-funded option.

The event will consist of around 40 minutes of presentations followed by a Question-and-Answer session. This should ensure that any questions that you may have (such as 'what happens if I want to move home?' and 'how much will it cost me each month?) will be answered.

Please note that free refreshments consisting of wine, soft drinks, tea, coffee and cake will be provided.

Please do pop in – hopefully you will find it very interesting.

## After School Drop In - Social Club

Since last September, the Youth Engagement Group of the Parish Council has organised a Drop in Centre at the Social Club for our village children in Years 6 to 11. The intention is to provide a safe place once a week for these young people to meet up and socialise with their friends, who on leaving Heathlands are spread out over many different Secondary Schools.

In practice it has catered for on average twelve participants, mainly from Heathlands, who have thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

The Centre has been run by a Youth Worker from YMCA with a small number of volunteers from the village. In the long term, this model is not sustainable financially nor is the demand placed on the small number of volunteers who have come forward.

As a result, unless more volunteers join the team, the project in its current form will come to an end at Easter.

However, those involved in running the

project and the Parish Council believe there is a need here to be satisfied, and the young people who currently attend have indicated that they would like to continue as they move through secondary school.

With this in mind, it is hoped that it will be possible to keep going after Easter, but this can only happen if enough volunteers come forward.

A rota can then be established which means that no one is committed for more than a couple of hours once every two or three weeks. Failing this, a new model may be considered, enabling the Centre to re-open in September for the autumn term.

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
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## Friends of St Mary's Old Church

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## 1st West Bergholt Scout Group

The Group has been busy in its commitment to provide young people with "skills for life" through fun activities and badge work, covering topics such as entertainment, money skills, emergency aid, communication, etc.

In the run-up to Christmas, our families were extremely generous in providing gifts for those who are homeless. We supported this initiative for many years when it was organised by the local Methodist Church. This year, we were able to present a large box of toiletries and clothing (such as gloves and hats) to Colchester Emergency Night Shelter for homeless men, and two large boxes to Next Chapter for women and children.

In January we held our annual jumble sale. Due to the community's generosity, we amassed a great amount of jumble, toys, books, jigsaws etc, and we generated over £1,000 for our funds. We make the most of the remaining items by working with the local NSPCC fundraisers to pass on books and jigsaws, and other items go to organisations that can recycle and reuse the jumble. Once again, we are grateful to the Village for its support.

In the last few weeks, members of the Cub Packs and Scout Troop helped out at Yarra Farm, Stanway, by planting saplings. Yarra is a farm-based facility for young people and adults with learning difficulties where they can have a safe, fun and invigorating environment. The Farm needed some help with planting saplings alongside existing hedges, and, with other volunteers, our Cubs and Scouts planted 600 whips in less than three hours. A truly great community effort.

Since the last Bulletin, one of our Young Leaders, Isla Roberts, has completed her visit to the Australian International Jamboree. It has given Isla experiences and memories which will last her a lifetime. Closer to home, Noah Gross and Etienne Saiz have been awarded their Chief Scout Bronze Awards and Wilf Dennis and Oliver Murphy have been awarded their Silver Awards. We have been able to introduce eight youngsters to Scouting since November 2024.

The Scout Group currently has around 80 young people in the four sections, from 6 to 15 years old. Scouting is very popular and we are having to run a waiting list for Beavers but, with more volunteers, we could eliminate the waiting list. ## **West Bergholt Allotments**

After a cold, wet summer in 2024, we are hoping for a better one this year!

The amount of produce available on the Charity stall last year was well down on previous years because of the poor weather. However, we still managed to provide some funds for the Bergholt Youth Group and the new Drop-in centre providing after school facilities for young people.

Our previous donation to Heathlands enabled them to purchase lots of items for their Forest School to encourage the youngsters to enjoy outdoors. Hopefully there will be a lot of sunshine to allow them to be used!

The Charity stall will be open on the 1st April and there should be lots of rhubarb available by then.

The site suffered from Potato Blight last year, which also affected tomatoes so plotholders should consider blight resistant varieties of both crops to mitigate this. Obviously crop

rotation is also important to avoid all sorts of diseases building up in the soil.

There was a big effort by two of our Committee members - Phil Harris and Colin Waylen - to cut down overgrown hedges and scrub on the side of the allotment site next to Church Close. This was a massive job as the hedge hadn't been cut for some time, but we are hoping to be able to maintain the improvement now that it has been cleared. Many thanks to both men for their hard work.


